At that time, John said to Jesus, "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied, "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us. Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward. "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. It is better for you to enter into life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, into the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to sin, cut if off. It is better for you to enter into life crippled than with two feet to be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. Dear St Pius And St Anthony Churches,

26th Sunday Ordinary Time Year B Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

Did I just hear John the apostle say that? "Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name, and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us" (Mark 9:38)? What? He prevented someone from doing good work in Jesus' Name? Is someone a little jealous? SO, is John saying that because the unknown Christian missionary doesn't follow us, then we should shut him/her down? Jesus nips in the bud, such territorialism or egomonopoly from John, by saying, 'Do not prevent him' (Mk 9:39). Jesus goes on to specify that any GOOD work done in His Name is to be supported and that all good work (even simple cups of water given in His Name) will be heavenly rewarded by Him (Mk 9:41). Is it only John among the apostles who tends to become jealous? We could wish that jealousy didn't creep into church work, but unfortunately human messengers are just that: human! Even among all the apostles we find such rivalry and jealousy. Recall that when James and John seek the 'coveted' positions of glory at Jesus' left and right in heaven, the other 'ten' apostles all become 'indignant' (Mark 10:41). A little jealous? Yet, in that case too, Jesus sits them all down and teaches that Christian leadership is 'Service of Others', and seeking to be the most humble and least of all. Jesus says in Mark 10:44, "whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all." Unfortunately, jealousy won't disappear among the apostles.

We will see that even after Jesus' resurrection, Peter gets a little 'nosey' by inquiring about the beloved disciple's especially close relationship to Jesus. In John 21:22, Jesus reminds Peter to stay focused on his own good work and not meddle in others' work, by saying to Peter, "What if I want him to remain until I come? What concern is it of yours? You follow me." Does that end such shortsightedness among the apostles? No, unfortunately we will hear later from Paul that even in the Early Church there are jealous factions fighting among believers. He confronts this jealousy in 1 Corinthians 3:4 "While there is jealousy and rivalry among you, are you not of the flesh, and behaving in an ordinary human way? Whenever someone says, 'I belong to Paul', and another, 'I belong to Apollos,' are you not merely human?" But no one escapes the pitfall of human jealousy as Paul himself will display it when he feels slighted by the judgmental comparison some have made between Paul and other apostles coming from Jerusalem. Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 11:5 that "I think that I am not in any way inferior to these "super-apostles." The sarcastic title 'super-apostles' gives Paul's jealousy away. Yet, upon prayer and reflection Paul knows that the true Christian leader is a humble servant who knows that it is God at work within and through him, as when he says, "Love is not jealous" (1 Corinthians 13:4). Paul realized his feelings and had said earlier that without the love of Christ in our hearts, even such a mighty spectacle like faith moving mountains amounts to nothing (1 Corinthians 13:2). So even for the apostles, we can say "Welcome to the fallen human family in need of a Savior". Whatever is each person's struggle with sin, we all need the forgiving grace of a Savior! Maybe it is not jealousy, but any one of a list of sins Jesus names in Mark 7:21-22 that we struggle with, such as "evil thoughts, malice, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, or folly" Thanks be to Jesus, that He comes to us and delivers us from our sins/faults. Yet we do have to follow and serve Him. A model mindset for any servant of Jesus is to keep in mind that God is the one working in us. We need only to serve God, then thank Him and get out of the way. This is what people mean when they say they can see Christ in another person-they see God at work in them. St Paul comes to humility when he says in 1 Corinthians 3:6-7 "I planted, Apollos watered, but God caused the growth. Therefore, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who causes the growth." Jesus once spoke about the ideal attitude of a disciple as the one exhibiting this frame of mind: "When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done only what we were obliged to do" (Luke 17:10). That is a humble servant! Peace, Fr Brian
