PONDERINGS FROM PASTOR CATHIE


To all of you who are dearly loved by God and called to be God's people. Grace to you and peace from

Service and Fellowship: A photo directory for CPC is being discussed and planned. The date of the Fall Bazaar/ Vendor Show has been changed to December 4.



For many years, our congregation has supported PATH by contributing to their youth who 'graduate' from the foster care system. Young adults are provided assistance in the transition from foster care to independent living in the areas of crisis management, education, employment, grocery shopping, housing, life skills, meal preparation, money management, nutrition, personal and home safety, peer socializing, positive parenting, and study skills.

Even with this training, these folks can become overwhelmed as they begin life on their own. That's where we come in. CPC helps provide many of the essential needs for their first home.

You can help by donating the following consumables: garbage bags, deodorant, contact solution, laundry soap/dryer sheets. dish soap, cleaning supplies, toilet paper, paper towels, and Ziploc bags. In addition, new or gently used donations of garbage cans, toasters, bed sheets, towel sets, dish sets, pillows, kitchen items, bathroom supplies, pots and pans, can openers, pizza cutters, vacuums, and reusable plastic containers would be welcomed.


