


## Hope United Church of Christ Moline, IL Worship Bulletin February 21, 2021 First Sunday in Lent

#### WELCOME AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

OPENING MEDITATION: (*Please light your candle at home; all 6 candles are lit in the sanctuary*) We have come together this morning for renewal—in worship and as a community of faith. We've greeted one another, typed in our hellos, laughed, and virtually hugged. But now the time of reflection and stillness is upon us. It is the first Sunday in Lent—the season for journeys of the heart. Close your eyes. Be still. Listen. We are entering a holy time. The Lenten candles have been lit, but over the next six weeks the light will slowly fade into darkness. For we are retelling the story of Jesus' betrayal and suffering and death. We do this not to be morbid, but because in the story of Jesus' death and resurrection, God is revealed—in the amazing transformation of death into life, in endings transformed into beginnings, and in dead-ends that become a source for new possibilities.

This is the sacred center of our faith—the truth made manifest in Jesus Christ—that God is in each and every one of us, quietly transforming us and the world. In his pain and suffering, Jesus speaks to every pain and loss you have endured and offers you the promise of transformation. It's an old story, but it still has the power to reveal, to heal, and to redeem. Jesus is at the heart of our faith, in the depth of our souls. He is waiting for us, inviting us to leave ordinary time and follow along with him on the journey that brought him to the Cross. Listen in silence, for Jesus is calling you. (a time of silence)

## **CALL TO WORSHIP**

One: Welcome to the time of covenant renewal. The God of our salvation greets us here.

Many: We are reminded of God's promises to us; We remember the promises we have made.

One: Sense the Spirit descending on us now. Hear God's welcoming voice.

Many: Surely God is with us. We can hear God calling our names.

One: See the rainbow in the sky. Wonder at God's steadfast love.

Many:All creation proclaims the wonders of God. We come together to learn what God wants to teach us.

## INVITING GOD INTO OUR MIDST

Lead us in your truth this day, gracious God. We long to know your ways and to be guided by your Spirit. Direct us into that realm where your purposes govern the hearts and minds of all your children. We want to grow in the likeness of Jesus, to learn to live in ways that are pleasing to you. We wait for you now, eager to respond to your instruction. Let nothing cut us off from you or separate us from one another, not only in this time of worship but as we face the challenges of another week. Amen.

## PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Have mercy on your church, O God, for we forget the covenant into which you call us. We muddle along in our self-serving schemes rather than waiting on your word. We follow the path of least resistance without seeking your higher way. We forget our baptism into a faith community built on trust and forgiveness. We turn from the vision of heaven to the treacherous hell of competing egos. O God, we turn to you to lead us to a new day. According to your steadfast love, forgive us, we pray. Amen.

## **HEBREW LESSONS**

Genesis 9: 8-17

<sup>8</sup>Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, <sup>9</sup>"As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, <sup>10</sup>and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark.<sup>£</sup> <sup>11</sup>I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." <sup>12</sup>God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: <sup>13</sup>I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. <sup>14</sup>When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, <sup>15</sup>I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. <sup>16</sup>When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." <sup>17</sup>God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth."

#### Psalm 25:1-10

- To you, O LORD, I lift up my soul.
- <sup>2</sup> O my God, in you I trust;

do not let me be put to shame;

do not let my enemies exult over me.

- Do not let those who wait for you be put to shame; let them be ashamed who are wantonly treacherous.
- Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths.
- Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all day long.
- <sup>6</sup> Be mindful of your mercy, O LORD, and of your steadfast love, for they have been from of old.
- Do not remember the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for your goodness' sake, O LORD!
- <sup>8</sup> Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in the way.
- 9 He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way.
- <sup>10</sup> All the paths of the LORD are steadfast love and faithfulness, for those who keep his covenant and his decrees.

## **NEW TESTAMENT LESSON**

Mark 1:9-15

<sup>9</sup>In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. <sup>10</sup>And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. <sup>11</sup>And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved;<sup>£</sup> with you I am well pleased."

<sup>12</sup>And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. <sup>13</sup>He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him.

<sup>14</sup>Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news<sup>£</sup> of God,<sup>£</sup> <sup>15</sup>and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near;<sup>£</sup> repent, and believe in the good news."<sup>£</sup>

One: And may the Holy Spirit our guide make you grow strong in faith and lead you in the ways of righteousness.

Many: We go in peace to love and serve the Lord, Amen.
