Homeowner's Association of Lake Ramsey Meeting Minutes June 22, 2023

I. CALL TO ORDER Bruce Sofge, President

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

Board Members Present: Bruce Sofge, Malcolm Schuler, Kirk Songy (via phone), Paul Falgoust, Maria Baronich, Leslie Barrios, and David Buccola and Dimy Cossich. Todd Meades was not in attendance.

18 residents were in attendance.

A GNO representative was not in attendance.

II. PRAYER

Prayer was offered by Dimy Cossich

III. PRESIDENT'S OPENING REMARKS

Bruce Sofge

The President welcomed everyone and reminded the directors that our purpose is to represent the membership of the HOA and to preserve or improve our property values, neighborhood quality of life, the gate, streets, drains and other infrastructure. He reminded the residents that they have elected the board of directors to do just that. The directors are not public safety officers and cannot enforce public safety. Public safety issues should be referred to the proper parish authorities.

A request was made to deviate from the agenda and move the Water Ski Slalom Course and Playground fundraising agenda items to the beginning of the meeting since many of the attendees planned to leave early to watch the LSU baseball game.

IV. Resident request to sponsor, self-fund, and install

Water Ski Slalom Course along phase 5 shoreline.

Bruce Sofge

Bruce stated he would make a motion for a Trial/Evaluation of the proposed slalom course and the motion was read.

The motion:

"Given that there are concerns regarding unknown impacts to a buoy course in Lake Ramsey

And given that resident Roman Williams is willing to fund and install said course at no cost to the HOA

And given that Mr. Williams believes the course will be an asset to the community,

The BOD authorizes Mr. Williams to install the course in the north lake along the undeveloped northeast lake boundary (Phase 5, Northlake Dr) for a trial period beginning as soon as possible after the July 4 holiday thru August 24, 2023. All course buoys will be at least 100ft off of the shoreline. The board will evaluate the impacts and take resident comments at the August 24 open BOD meeting and may decide to end the trial and have the course removed or extend the trial for a TBD period."

Then the meeting was open for resident comments. The majority of the residents were against the Slalom Course and were not in favor of a Trial Evaluation. After the open discussion, Bruce said he would make the motion in the board's Executive Session after briefing the board on additional comments received privately by board members from residents who wanted to remain anonymous. Several residents voiced their displeasure in the vote of the board being conducted without the residents present.

Dimy Cossich made the motion: "To have a vote on Bruce's motion now in the Open Session." This motion was seconded by Malcolm Schuler. This motion was approved by 6 board members voting in favor and 1 board member abstaining.

At this time Bruce made the motion (see above).

There was no Second for this motion. Therefore, the motion was not passed.

VIII. TREASURER'S REPORT

This is a cash-basis report.

Operating account bank balance on May 1, 2023, was \$123,159.63.

Net deposits were \$1,381.65.

Paid expenses were \$24,026.44 resulting in a May 31, 2023, bank balance of \$100,514.84.

Included in the ending balance of funds is \$ 1,349.95 representing "prepaid" 2024 assessments which is not available for payment of 2023 expenses.

The Board collected the \$180 for the Nov. 2022 damage to the gate motor. The resident who damaged the gate did not voluntarily pay; however, with camera evidence, police reports and the HOA filing charges, the money was collected.

The cost of the May 31, 2023, damage when a vehicle hit the exit gate was \$1,105. After multiple conversations, emails, and a meeting to review the camera footage, a check was delivered on Tuesday, June 20, 2023, for the cost of the repair.

Reserve account balances are reflected on the Balance Sheet.
