

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) Sunday 29 September 2024 110th World Day of Migrants and Refugees "God walks with His People."

Every journey has a leader. For the Israelite people, who were living as slaves in Egypt, that leader was Moses. With God's prompting, and the support of Aaron and Miriam, Moses courageously led the people on their exodus journey to the Promised Land.

However, even the best human leader cannot replace God. In the story from Numbers, God's Spirit empowered seventy elders to share Moses's burden of leadership. On their way to the Promised Land, a shared and commissioned leadership was better able to address all of their difficulties and challenges. When the Israelites were about to finally arrive, Moses himself reached the end of his life and was instructed not to go on. As Joshua took up his new position, Moses reassured the people, "It is the Lord your God who goes with you; he will not fail you or forsake you." (Deuteronomy 31:6)

Pope Francis's theme for the 110th World Day of Migrants and Refugees is "God walks with his people". He says that "Many migrants experience God as their travelling companion, guide and anchor of salvation". Through their exile, wilderness journey and final arrival, the people who were following Moses discovered that they were really following God, who went before them and walked alongside them. The meeting tent that protected the ark of the covenant was a symbol of this presence; of a God who stayed close along the journey.

So many migrants and refugees face such challenges and difficulties along their way. They can be separated from families and loved ones, lost, bereaved, exhausted, hurt or afraid of the future. They can experience people who are unwelcoming or hostile to them in their time of vulnerability. James in his letter today reminds us that God sees the disregard and injustice of the rich and comfortable. Our relationship with those who are suffering has eternal implications.

Yet Jesus reminds us that the opposite is also true. Those who offer merely "a cup of water to drink" will not lose their reward. Our kindness and generosity brings life to both the giver and receiver. As Pope Francis says, God not only walks with migrants and refugees, but within them. God "identifies himself with men and women on their journey through history, particularly with the least, the poor and the marginalized." In serving the least of our brothers and sisters, we encounter Jesus himself.

Therefore, as a Church walking a synodal journey together, we recognise God as our true guide along the way. We see the value in shared leadership and our responsibility to welcome the stranger. And in the symbols of our liturgy, we remember God's enduring

presence, walking alongside and within each one of us. (110th World Day of Migrants and Refugees 2024: Australian Catholic Migrant and Refugee Office)

110th World Day of Migrants and Refugees – Sunday, 29 September 2024

The firstfruits of hope (Rom 8:19-25)

Pope Francis is increasingly concerned about what kind of world will be left for younger generations — and the prognosis is not good. "This isn't pessimism," the Pope told about two dozen representatives of popular movements and grassroots organisations meeting Sept. 20 at the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development.

Pope Francis said he feared adults are leaving behind "a world discouraged, inferior, violent, marked by the plundering of nature, alienated by dehumanised modes of communication," and "without the political, social and economic paradigms to lead the way, with few dreams and enormous threats."

But, he said, if people join forces, especially with those who are most often the victims, things can change. And he prayed that "the cry of the excluded" would "awaken the slumbering consciences of so many political leaders who are ultimately the ones who must enforce economic, social and cultural rights." The answer and the key to hope is love, he said. The fight for social justice, for respect for the sacredness of all human life and for care for creation must all be motivated by love.

Mission Sunday


