September Meeting—Make It Take It

Welcome to the "Make it Take It", our opening meeting and project for the fall season. I will be teaching a simple picture that you can frame or cut in half for a card. The following items are supplies that I'm requesting for you to bring:

2 water containers (small)

1 circle bubble plastic palette (Pictured here)

One piece of heavy cardboard (back of paper palette pad, small piece of Masonite (8 $1/2 \ge 11$), clip board) This will be used only for support

Brushes—#4, #6, or a #8 round brush that you are comfortable with and maybe a 1" flat (acrylic or watercolor) The rest will be furnished by the chapter.








Beth started the meeting by reading an excerpt from this book, adapting it to painting

Recipe Corner—Beth brought to May meeting

Hot Corn Dip from Tim and Jess

2 cans mexicorn
2 cups shredded Jack cheese
1 1/2 to 2 cups shredded parmesan cheese
2 small cans of diced green chilies
1 cup mayo
Salt/Pepper/Paprika to taste

Heat oven to 375. Mix all ingredients together and pour into a baking dish. Leave in oven until edges are bubbling and cheese is melted. Serve with fritos or your chips of choice

Brush Cleaning Tip

If someone sends you flowers, and they come with their stems inserted in those nifty water tubes, here is a great tip for those times when you forget to clean your brushes:

Pour an inch or so of Murphy's Oil Soap into the tubes. Thread the brush handle through the hole in the tub lids then suspend the hard-as-a-rock bristles in the soap. Don't let the bristles touch the bottom of the tubes and make sure the top of the metal ferrule is above the soap. The tops of the tubes will grip the brush handles tightly. Prop the tubes up in a container and let the brushes soak overnight.

Next day, clean as you normally would, and voilà, the brushes are as good as new.


.The Board has decided that we can support two seminars next year.


