Of Commitment and Life Reality

It was all joy and smiles all around. It was the priestly ordination of 13 young men at the Cathedral of St. Patrick in Manhattan on May 28th. As I watched them process up to the altar, I knew the joy and excitement in their hearts. I've been there. As they processed down the aisle after Mass, I knew their emotions and thoughts - somehow. As they blessed their relatives and friends, I could recognize that feeling of amazement, among others. Their zeal at that point would have no limit. Their commitment would be way beyond 100%. I remember lying prostrate on the floor as the bishop invoked the Holy Spirit upon us. I gave my all and promised my all.

Think of one time you've had to make a commitment wholeheartedly. For us priests and religious, that would probably be the ordination or religious profession day. For those who are married, you too would have had that feeling as you vowed to love and cherish your spouse until death breaks the bond of marriage. For those who have never tied the knot, another example should suffice, like when you were baptized (if baptized as adult) or when you made your First Communion. Either way, I'm sure each of us can find a time in their lives when their commitment to God was at its pinnacle. You felt you could do anything for God.

Then months and years later, daily realities of that commitment set in. For couples it's said that the years after the arrival of the first baby are some of the hardest. It's also said that the first five years is normally the toughest for newly wed couples. Regardless of your state in life, the realities of your commitment to God sets in sooner rather than later. The readings this weekend invite us to reflect on how we've been handling those commitments.

I'll be 20 years in the priesthood this June 29th. Fr. Anthony Mbanefo will be 24 years in the priesthood on July 1st. For me it's a time to reflect on how I'm living my commitment and how I could do it better. My dream would be to never forget that day I laid prostrate on the floor - a sign of total commitment to God. I have never doubted my commitment to God. And I'm sure you probably (hopefully) have not either. If you have, the fact that you're reading this shows that you're still committed to God. The problem, however, is the degree of implementation.

I've always heard complaints from parishioners everywhere I have gone, about how people commit to help in one thing or another but fail to show up. That normally meant that someone else is then saddled with double duties. It's the same with our commitment to God. When we fail to show up (physically and otherwise), we cause problems for others and worse still, we leave God stranded (humanly speaking). Yes, things come up and life happens to us, but we must strive always to keep our commitment with God. Elisha kept his commitment to the end (1 Kings 19:16-21). Paul lived out his commitment and invites us to do the same (Galatians 5:1,13-18). Finally, the gospel (Luke 9:51-62) warns us to never look back once we commit to God. Imagine where you and I would be if God for once fails to honor his commitment to us! Phewwww!

May we strive more to keep our commitment no matter what hand life deals us. Amen


