AMANA NEWS AND NOTES

Agri Tourism Site In Development

A farm oriented play area with hay bale slide, corn maze, tree houses and and more is being considered to surround the former Creamery Theatre, now the Amana Performing Arts Center.

The Amana Society is doing a marketing and feasibility study for the project, which likely would start with 15 to 20 acres with potential to expand to 150 acres depending on which activities they plan to develop, Greg Luerkens, ASI President and CEO told the Cedar Rapids Gazette this week.

"Over time, the investment in the agritourism project will be significant," he said. "We are currently working on separating the project into phases and compiling cost estimates." He was reported as saying in the Gazette article.

The Society's goal is to develop a family-friendly venue that will serve the Corridor and also draw visitors from across the region. This would be operated alongside the new Amana Performing Arts Center.

But that requires cleaning up the venue after two years of no shows and little upkeep. Volunteers are meeting to work on the theatre this Saturday morning. ASI staff and volunteers have already painted the stage and the Amana Society is working with a vendor to install new lighting and sound components and replacing the large screen on stage.

The exterior of the structure will be repaired and upgraded while the courtyard on the west side of the venue will be cleaned up and made ready to host weekend blue grass jam sessions and a flea market with a pop-up food vendor this summer. More on this as summer approaches.

The theater will host the show "Weekend Comedy" by Jeanne and Sam Bobrick at 7:30 p.m. May 20 and 21. Produced by Tom Milligan and Deb Kennedy this witty show about a weekend mix-up will kick off the new generation of entertainment at the APAC.

REMINDER CONCERNING SOUTH DUMP

The area commonly referred to as the “South Dump,” is private property and **only** for the use of Amana Society (ASI) stock holders living within the Amana Colonies. The “dump” may be under 24 hour photo surveillance and closed without notice if ASI and DNR rules are violated.

Absolutely No burning. Burning is dangerous and not compliant with DNR Regulations.

Only organic compostable yard refuse is allowed. Users **will** remove plastic bags or other containers used to transfer yard waste. Lumber, and other building material, & trash dumping is absolutely **NOT** permitted.

Using the dump is a privilege, not a right, and all dumping will end if Iowa Dept. of Natural Resources (DNR) and Amana Society rules on what may be dumped or the burning ban are violated.

If you witness violations of these rules, **please** report, to A.S.I. Conservation at 319-560-2459.

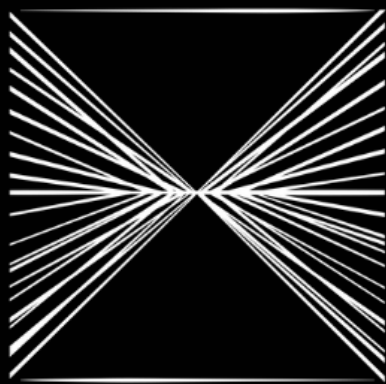
