
As we celebrate Black History this month let us remember those pioneers who went before us and upon whose shoulders we stand.

It is not enough to have minds equipped with truth; we must have hearts moved with compassion for those around us. This study will give you practical ways you can love, support, and minister to those in crisis.

We're going to tackle some of the most challenging issues of our day. If you will engage these sessions, you will be ready to minister to someone who is considering abortion, to those who are poor, when sickness comes to stay, when sex threatens to destroy, when families are torn apart by homosexuality, and when someone is trapped by pornography.

Andraé Edward Crouch

(July 1, 1942 – January 8, 2015) ...Singer, Songwriter, Musician, Producer and Pastor...



...was an American gospel singer, songwriter, arranger, record producer and pastor. Referred to as "the father of modern gospel music" by contemporary Christian and gospel music professionals, Crouch was known for his compositions "The Blood Will Never Lose Its Power", "My Tribute (To God Be the Glory)" and "Soon and Very Soon". In secular music, he was known for his collaborative work during the 1980s with Stevie Wonder,

Elton John and Quincy Jones as well as conducting choirs that sang on the Michael Jackson hit "Man in the Mirror" and Madonna's "Like a Prayer". Crouch was noted for his talent of incorporating contemporary secular music styles into the gospel music he grew up with. His efforts in this area were what helped in paving the way for early American contemporary Christian music during the 1960s and 1970s. Crouch's original music arrangements were heard in the films *The Color Purple* and Disney's *The Lion King*, as well as the NBC television series *Amen*. Awards received by him include seven Grammy Awards, being inducted into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame in 1998, and receiving a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame in 2004 Crouch's first group musical effort was formed in 1960 as the Church of God in Christ Singers. The group included future recording artist and session musician Billy Preston on

keyboards and was the first to record the Crouch's song "The Blood Will Never Lose Its Power". The song's popularity grew following the initial 1969 recording, becoming a standard in churches and hymnals worldwide. While attending Valley Junior College in the San Fernando Valley to become a teacher, he formed gospel music group "The Disciples" in 1965 with fellow musicians Perry Morgan, Reuben Fernandez, and Bili Thedford. The group became a frequent attraction at "Monday Night Sing" concerts in southern California put on by Audrey Mieir, a Christian minister and music composer who



frequently sponsored new Christian music groups. Following Mieir's introduction of Crouch to Manna Music Publishing's founders Tim and Hal Spencer, Manna published Crouch's song "The Blood Will Never Lose Its Power", written when he was 15 years old. Crouch's most popular songs from this period include "The Blood Will Never Lose Its Power", "Through It All", "Bless His Holy Name", "Soon and Very Soon", "Jesus is the Answer", and "My Tribute". His affiliation with Light Records was instrumental in bringing Walter and Tramaine Hawkins, Jessy Dixon and The Winans to the label, from where they all enjoyed successful gospel music careers. In 1996, Crouch and his music were honored on the Grammy Award-winning CD, *Tribute: The Songs of Andraé Crouch*, released by Warner Bros. Records. The album featured a wide range of artists performing Crouch's classic songs and featured the Brooklyn Tabernacle Choir, Take 6, Twila Paris, and Michael W. Smith.

Crouch and his sister Sandra had a friendship and music relationship with Michael Jackson. In 1987, the Andraé Crouch Choir sang background vocals along with Siedah Garrett, Glen Ballard, and The Winans on Jackson's hit single "Man in the Mirror" from the *Bad* album. The Andraé Crouch Singers were also featured on the songs "Keep the Faith" and "Will You Be There" from Jackson's 1991 *Dangerous* album.



On Jackson's *HIStory: Past, Present and Future, Book I* project in 1995, the Andraé Crouch Choir is heard on "Earth Song." Crouch's composition, "Soon and Very Soon" was performed by the Andraé Crouch Choir at the public memorial service for Jackson held at the Staples Center in Los Angeles on July 7, 2009.

Between 1993 and 1994 Crouch suffered the loss of his father, mother, and older brother. After his father's death, Crouch and his sister took over the shared duty of senior pastor at the church his parents founded, Christ Memorial Church of God in Christ in Pacoima, California.

Crouch was hospitalized in early December 2014 for pneumonia and congestive heart failure. As a result, his December tour was postponed. He was hospitalized again on January 3, 2015 in Los Angeles, as the result of a heart attack. Crouch died five days later at Northridge Hospital Medical Center on January 8, 2015, at the age of 72. On the same day, his sister, Sandra, released the following statement: "Today my twin brother, womb-mate and best friend went home to be with the Lord. Please keep me, my family and our church family in your prayers. I tried to keep him here but God loved him best."

Following Crouch's death, Christian recording artist Michael W. Smith told *Billboard* Magazine, "...I'll never forget hearing Andraé for the first time. It was like someone had opened a whole new world of possibilities for me musically. I don't think there is anyone who inspired me more, growing up, than Andraé Crouch. The depth of his influence on Christian music is incalculable. We all owe him so much and I'll forever be grateful for the times we got to work together."



Eat PRODUCE at every meal

There are numerous benefits to making produce a main attraction at mealtime. Fruits and veggies also help displace foods that pack more calories per bite, a plus if you're trying to lose weight.

How to do it: A good rule of thumb is to include a serving of fruit in each

breakfast and snack, and two servings of veggies in every lunch and dinner. One serving is 1 cup fresh, about the size of a tennis ball. Whip fruit into a smoothie, add it to oatmeal or yogurt, or just bite right in.

Make WATER your beverage of choice

According to a study in the American Journal of Clinical Nutrition, people who get much of their daily fluid intake from plain water tend to have healthier diets overall, including more fiber, less sugar, and fewer high-calorie foods. One study found that people who drank about 7 cups of water a day, ate nearly 200 fewer daily calories compared to those who gulped less than one glass. Another found that when adults drank 2 cups of water right before eating a meal they ate between 75 and 90 fewer calories. And a German study concluded that consuming 16-ounces of water upped calorie burning by 30% within 10 minutes, an effect that was sustained for more than an hour.

How to do it: Reach for 16 ounces (2 cups) of water four times a day. And if you dislike the taste of plain H2O, spruce it up. Add wedges of lemon or lime, fresh mint leaves, cucumber slices, fresh grated ginger or organic citrus zest, or a bit of mashed juicy fruit, like berries or tangerine wedges.

Make Real Food Easy

Healthy foods should be the easy snacking options around the house. We grab for chips or cookies because chips and cookies are there. If fruit is sitting in a bowl on the counter, we would grab for that instead.



Real foods should also be the easy meal options around the house. This takes planning. We often stop at the drive-thru for a quick dinner instead of going to the grocery store to pick up food to prepare. Make your trips to the grocery store last for the week. Plan out the meals you will eat every night so that the quick fast food stop is not even a temptation.

FRESH CHILI

INGREDIENTS

Paprika (to taste) 6 tomatoes (preferably vine) 8oz Kidney Beans 1lb ground beef (85 lean/15 fat) or 1lb ground chicken ½ yellow onion 2 clove garlic (or powder) 1 green pepper Chili Powder (2-4 tbsp) to taste 1 ½ tbsp sea salt 1 tbsp red pepper flakes Cayenne pepper (optional) ½ tbsp ground cumin

INSTRUCTIONS

- Dice and stew tomatoes on low-med heat in saucepan or high heat in a crock pot
- In a separate pan, sauté diced onion, green pepper and garlic then add ground beef

 (cook til brown).
- Be sure to LIGHTLY season meat and veggies.
- Add cooked meat and veggies once tomatoes are softened and stewing.
- Be sure to mash tomatoes while cooking.
- Add the chili powder, red pepper flakes, cayenne, cumin and sea salt
- Turn slow cooker to low heat or in stove top, pan to simmer and let cook for 30 minutes
- When done, add cheese and/or sour cream if desired

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~ THE LENTEN SEASON of SUNDAYS ~ Beginning Wednesday, February 18, 2015

Lent is a period of fasting, moderation, and self-denial traditionally observed by Catholics and some Protestant denominations. It begins with Ash Wednesday and ends with Easter Sunday. The length of the **Lenten** fast was established in the 4th century as 46 days (40 days, not counting Sundays).

There are several holy days within the season of Lent:

- Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent for Roman Catholics and most mainline Reformed and Protestant traditions.
- Clean Monday (or "Ash Monday") is the first day of Lent in Eastern Catholic and Orthodox Churches.
- By Pontifical decree, there is no Ash Wednesday in the Ambrosian Rite, and Lent begins liturgically on what the Roman Rite regards as first Sunday in Lent. Traditionally, the fast began on the first Monday of Lent as also reflected in the Mozarabic rite.
- The Sundays in Lent carry Latin names in German Lutheranism, derived from the beginning of the Sunday's introit. The first is called Invocabit, the second Reminiscere, the third Oculi, the fourth Laetare, the fifth Judica. The sixth Sunday is Palm Sunday.
- The fourth Sunday in Lent, which marks the halfway point between Ash Wednesday and Easter, is referred to as Laetare Sunday by Roman Catholics, Anglicans, and many other Christians because of the traditional Entrance Antiphon of the Mass. Due to the more "joyful" character of the day (since*laetare* in Latin means "rejoice"), the priest (as well as deacon and subdeacon) has the option of wearing vestments of a rose colour (pink) instead of violet.
- The fourth Lenten Sunday, Mothering Sunday, which has become known as Mother's Day in the United Kingdom and an occasion for honouring mothers of children, has its origin in a sixteenth-century celebration of the Mother Church.
- The fifth Sunday in Lent, also known as Passion Sunday (however, that term is also applied to Palm Sunday) marks the beginning of Passiontide.
- The sixth Sunday in Lent, commonly called Palm Sunday, marks the beginning of Holy Week, the final week of Lent immediately preceding Easter.
- Wednesday of Holy Week, Holy Wednesday (also sometimes known as Spy Wednesday) commemorates the day on which Judas spied on Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane before betraying him.
- **Thursday is known as Maundy Thursday**, or Holy Thursday, and is a day Christians commemorate the Last Supper shared by Christ with his disciples.
- The next day is **Good Friday**, on which Christians remember Jesus' crucifixion and burial.
