Program Descriptions

<p>Mansion Tour: Building a Home</p>	<p>Here at Borderland State Park, the Ames family’s home, a three-story stone mansion built in 1910, still stands. Its twenty rooms are furnished much as they were when the Ameses lived here and many of Blanche Ames’ paintings grace the walls. Come get a look at the fully furnished interior of the Ames Mansion, including the ornate two-story library. On this 30 minute tour, explore the history of the family and the house itself. First floor only. For adults and older children. Meet in front of the Ames Mansion. Rain, snow or shine.</p>
<p>Off the Beaten Path Hike</p>	<p>Borderland encompasses 1773 acres of woodlands, fields, ponds and unique geological formations. The park is truly a “borderland” in that it lies between gradually rising hills to the north and much flatter land to the south. The result is a mix of habitats, supporting a rich variety of wildlife. Explore the less traveled trails on this 3- to 4-mile informative and recreational hike. Route and theme varies weekly. Dress for the weather, bring water, and wear bug repellent. Hike is easy to moderate in difficulty. For adults and older children. Meet at the Visitor Center. Downpour, snow, or icy trails cancel.</p>
<p>Mansion Tour: Of Governors and Generals</p>	<p>Celebrate Black History Month at Borderland and learn how Oakes and Blanche Ames’ ancestors stories tie into the African American story. Did you know that Blanche and Oakes Ames are related to many politicians and military war heroes? To understand a family, one must look back at previous generations. The Ames Family and their relatives played an intrinsic role in shaping the state of Massachusetts and the Nation. Join the Park Interpreter for a 30-minute guided tour learning about the Ames family involvement in war and in politics. For adults and older children. Children must be accompanied by an adult. <p>A Presidential Mansion Tour: Of Governors and Generals</p>	<p>Celebrate Presidents Day at Borderland on this adapted tour. Having a family with a lot of political connection, naturally they crossed paths with Presidents. To understand a family, one must look back at previous generations. The Ames Family and their relatives played an intrinsic role in shaping the state of Massachusetts and the Nation. Join the Park Interpreter for a 45-minute guided tour learning about the Ames family involvement in war and in politics. For adults and older children. Children must be accompanied by an adult. Meet in front of the Ames Mansion. Rain, snow or shine.</p>
<p>Kids Mansion Tour</p>	<p>What would it be like to be a kid living in this mansion? Learn about the Ames family and the four children who grew up in this beautiful mansion. Great for families with younger kids to explore the first floor of the mansion. Join the Park interpreter for this 15-minute tour, which will conclude with an old fashion activity behind the mansion (weather permitting). Meet in front of the mansion. Children must be accompanied by an adult. Rain or shine.</p>
<p>Coloring, Coffee & Conversation</p>	<p>Join the park staff in the visitor center for some coffee and conversation while we use adult age coloring books to make our own masterpieces, as Blanche Ames once did at Borderland. Coloring utensils, coloring books, coffee and great conversation will be provided. Feel free to bring your own coloring book or your own art supplies. For older children and adults. Rain, snow or shine.</p>

<p>Share Your Love with Nature Hike</p>	<p>On Valentine's day, share your love with the natural world by joining us at Borderland for a 3 mile hike around Lower Leech Pond. Meet at the visitor center. What would Valentine's Day be without chocolate? After the easy to moderate hike, join us back inside the visitor center for some hot chocolate in front of the fire.
