- FDOE CTE Basic Skills Assessment Technical Assistance paper states that you must follow test publisher guidelines, CTE and DRC/CTB recommend certification
- DRC/CTB recommends trained persons take refresher training every two years

Hartwick Symposium

- Focuses on current advances and innovative strategies regarding inclusive postsecondary education (IPSE) for students with intellectual disabilities.



Specialized Career Education Curriculum Framework (PSAV)

- Deleting two programs:
 - CTE for Students with Disabilities (PSAV)
 - Supported Competitive Employment, Phase 1
- Creating two new programs:
 - Specialized Career Education, Basic
 - Specialized Career Education, Advanced
- Each program will be 450 hours, 3 courses, 1 OCP
- Basic feeds into Advanced, which is a Terminal program
 - Ultimate goal is employment



MOCPs

- Rule 6A-1.09963 allows for the modification of established OCPs
- Rule 6A-6.0312 repealed
- Data element 151625 for reporting completions
- To report, the student must:
 - be a secondary student with exceptionalities
 - have a current IEP that includes the MOCP
 - take access courses and participate in alternate assessment, and
 - achieve the modified outcome as described in the IEP.



Florida Postsecondary Comprehensive Transition Program Act (FPCTP)

- Purpose is to increase independent living opportunities, inclusive and experiential postsecondary education, and employment opportunities for students with intellectual disabilities through degree, certificate or nondegree programs.
- Establishes the Florida Center for Students with Unique Abilities for the statewide coordination of information regarding programs and services for students with disabilities.
- s. 1004.6495, F.S., effective July 1, 2016



FPCTP

- A process through which eligible postsecondary institutions in Florida can voluntarily seek approval to offer a FPTCP for students with intellectual disabilities
- Provides financial assistance in the form of an FPCTP Scholarship and grants to develop new programs



Center for Unique Abilities

- Dr. Paula D. Kohler, Executive Director
- The center will:
 - serve the entire state
 - provide parents of students with intellectual disabilities with information about college programs and opportunities across Florida
 - offer financial support for students with intellectual disabilities to earn degrees or certificates and enter the workforce



Non-traditional Perkins Mini - Grant Opportunity

- One per district
- Up to \$10,000
- Must be on non-traditional list
- May be for either males or females
- After school or added as part of existing curriculum
- Due August 26

Sisters of N.E.W. (Nontraditional Employment for Women)

- Must be at least 18 years old and have a high school diploma or GED, reliable, motivated and willing and able to perform 8 hours of physical work per day. (female veterans, low income women, and women on welfare)
- Prepares women for nontraditional careers in the construction, utilities, and transportation industries.

Sisters of N.E.W.

- Programs include a mix of hands-on shop skills, classroom instruction, physical fitness assessment, job development and placement services, social service referrals, and case management.
- Basic carpentry, electricity, painting and plumbing, job safety, trades math, blueprint reading, interview strategies, life skills
- After graduating NEW graduates enter apprenticeship programs and begin working in the construction, utilities, and transportation industries.



TABE and Out of Range Scores

- Out of range scores are those that are greater than plus or minus two grade equivalents outside of the content difficulty range of the level of test.
 - D level in range scores are 4.0 to 10.9. Content difficulty range is 6.0 8.9
 - A level in range scores are 7.0 to 12.9. Content difficulty range is 5.0 – 12.9+
- If the program requirements are 9th grade or below, recommend using D level if not using locator test
- If the program requirements are 10th grade or above, recommend using A level if not using locator test



TABE and **Out** of Range Scores

- Are test scores in range?
- If not, you must retest. The state will not accept out-of-range scores for reporting program completion
 - Do not report out-of-range scores
 - A student may not be counted as a completer from a CTE program if the test score is out of range (greater than plus or minus two GEs outside the content difficulty range)

CTE Out-of-Range Scores

- Student is a CTE student with 9.0 basic skills requirements and tests on D level at or above 9.0 and less than 10.9
 - Score may be reported and student reported as completer
- Student is a CTE student with 9.0 basic skills requirements and tests on D level at or above 11.0.
 - Student must be retested on A level
- Student is a CTE student with 10.0 basic skills requirements and tests on D level at or above 11.0.
 - Student must be retested on A level
