May is a highlighting-composers month for the Chancel Choir. Several arrangements by current writers/composers Stuart Townend, Keith Getty and Kristyn Getty are in the rehearsal queue. One of the tunes is "What Grace is Mine", which is the familiar tune "Londonderry Air" (*O Danny Boy*). It imparts a fresh new text by Kristyn Getty that is at once graceful and powerful. One of the verses begins, "What grace is mine to know his breath alive in me; beneath his wings my weary soul may soar." Jenny Pippin is going to add her flute playing to one of the communion Sunday anthems, and she will offer instrumental music during the serving of Holy Communion.

One of our favorite anthems for May is written by Senator Orrin Hatch (b. 1934 in Pittsburgh), from the great state of Utah. I have said that with great certainty for 14 years. I am now more convinced than ever that we, all of us, have been given more gifts than we have received.
