#### Saturday Evening Banquet

Dr. Spencer Pelton, the Wyoming State Archaeologist, will present on the Sisters Hill Site at the Saturday evening banquet. This site, located near Buffalo, Wyoming, was one of the first buried Paleoindian campsites investigated in Wyoming but has been subject to relatively limited archaeological inquiry compared to other sites discovered during a similar era. Renewed investigations at Sisters Hill since 2017 have clarified several unresolved questions regarding the site and yielded surprising new insights, the most notable of which is the presence of multiple later Paleoindian components at the site. This presentation provides an updated view of the Sisters Hill Site 60 years in the making, presenting new radiocarbon dates, paleoenvironmental analyses, and a summary of a newly discovered Cody component from Wyoming's newest old stratified Paleoindian site.

Option 1: Friday, May 1<sup>st</sup> – Guided Historic Downtown Sheridan Walking Tour | 12:30 p.m.–1:30 p.m. Join us for a guided walking tour covering over 140 years of history and architecture in Sheridan's beautiful downtown. Meet at the Downtown Sheridan Association (DSA) office (121 S. Main Street) at 12:30 p.m. This guided tour is offered free of charge courtesy of DSA volunteers.

Option 2: Sunday, May 3<sup>rd</sup> – Fort Phil Kearny Historic Site | Johnson County, WY | 8:30 a.m.–1:00 p.m. Meet at the fort (528 Wagon Box Road, Banner, WY) at 8:30 a.m., a 25 minute drive from Sheridan. Historian Bob Wilson will provide an overview of the history and archaeology of Fort Phil Kearny, the Fetterman Battle, and the Wagon Box Fight. The cost of the tour is \$10.00. Feel free to bring a sack lunch for a picnic!

Option 3: Sunday, May 3<sup>rd</sup> – Benson's Butte Site | Big Horn County, MT | 8:00 a.m.–4:00 p.m. Dr. Cody Newton will lead a tour to explore Benson's Butte and the surrounding area. Benson's Butte (24BH1726) contains prehistoric petroglyphs and the remains of a dwelling as well as a historic rock art panel. We will also visit the historic Cook's Cabin. Meet at the hotel's Convention Center entrance at 8:00 a.m. to carpool. The drive to the site is about 1 hour on rough roads. The hike around the butte is moderately strenuous and hazardous conditions may exist. The cost of the tour is \$15.00 and the maximum participant allowance is 30 people. Please bring water, a sack lunch, sunscreen, and sturdy hiking shoes. Due to inclement weather, the field trip will be cancelled and refunds will be distributed.
