Hope all is well with you and games are still happening!

Take a look at today's double whistle clip here.

Obviously we have a double whistle. Discussion one – did they react to the double whistle correctly? YES! This was textbook in their communication. The C kept walking/closing down towards the L and they both held their signal with the fist still in the air as they talked. The L took it after the C pointed for him to take it. This is perfect communication on this double whistle. Discussion two – were both the L and C looking where they should have been? It was a secondary defender, so L definitely needs to officiate this and it was in his primary. The C had one uncontested matchup in his primary and had a clear look through to the crash. It may have been a little out of his PCA but he had a great look. I would also imagine that he gave the play up to the L SINCE it was out of his PCA and L did have a whistle.

Bottom line is that they communicated very well on the double whistle here. This is not an uncommon place on the floor/play where a double whistle might occur. Talk in your pregame conference about double whistles (and how to avoid them)...and that communication is key.
