CLOSE, BUT FAR AWAY?



We often talk about meeting someone halfway, mostly not literally. A movie came out in August called *The Hundred-Foot Journey*. It's a beautiful movie about a feud between two adjacent restaurants, one owned

by a well-known French chef, and the other by an Indian man who had just moved into town with his family. He too, was an equally experienced chef. The restaurants are one hundred feet from each other. Inevitably, that is humanly, competition ensued from the very beginning, along with dirty tactics that escalated to the burning down of one of the restaurants (I'll let you find out which). The rest of the movie was about how both parties fought each other and finally made peace. They were physically separately by a hundred feet but they were miles apart in terms of being good neighbors to each other. It was a tough and torturous journey but they made it anyway. It took a lot of fight, humility, owning up to their mistakes, asking for forgiveness, and hard work to meet each other halfway.

Such a beautiful movie. Says a lot about how we could be so close physically and yet so far apart in just about every other way. Am sure you know neighbors who live next to each other and yet because of hostility, jealousy, hatred, competition, envy, anger, bias, petty conflicts, slander, gossip, etc, are unable to traverse the few yards that separate them from one another literally, not to talk of bridging the miles of differences that keep them separated. Sadly, sometimes people, Christians, live in the same space, for years, but remain apart.

The Prophet Isaiah calls us today, as we continue our Advent journey, to make straight those crooked or untraveled paths. Like the two restaurant owners in the movie, we must find ways to bridge our differences, close the gap of misunderstanding and strive to live in peace. We must do so in our families, work places, schools, and in our society. The recent wave of mistrust and violence between law enforcement officers and the public, especially, African American males, is one example of the distance that needs to be bridged.

Hopefully, Christians will hear the voice that cries out in the desert: Prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God" (Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11), especially during these Advent and Christmas Seasons. I'm sure that you have some paths you need to straighten up in your life and in your family and workplace. If today you hear the word of God, harden not your heart" (Hebrews 3:7-8). Amen.
