#### **REV. JAMES THOMAS PASTOR**

Welcoming a new pastor is an exciting time, a new beginning for both the congregation and the new minister. I have gleaned these suggestions from a variety of sources. To maximize this new beginning, it is important to prepare spiritually, cognitively, and emotionally for a new chapter.

There are a few things you can do to prepare personally and congregationally to follow a new spiritual leader:

#### Prepare to welcome your new pastor

- 1. Open your hearts and decide that you are going to love the pastor.
- 2. Invite church members individually to send cards and encouragement to the incoming pastor.
- 3. Embrace the uniqueness of your pastor. The new pastor has a distinct personality, a unique set of spiritual gifts, a communications style, and a diverse set of experiences. When the Spirit leads a church to a new pastor, the Spirit seldom leads a church to a person just like the previous pastor. To compare your new pastor to any other is to disrespect the Spirit's role in guiding you to your new pastor in the first place.
- 4. Give your pastor permission to fail. The best pastors don't succeed 100% of the time.

#### Say goodbye to Pastor Thomas in a healthy way

- 7. Show love, regard, and even grief. This is one of the best things you can do for the new pastor.
- 8. Say thank you and goodbye to Pastor Thomas.
- 9. Express appreciation in ways that are consistent with what you have done in the past.
- 10.Do not invite Pastor Thomas to return for weddings, funerals, or baptisms. This establishes your new pastor as everyone's pastor from the beginning.

#### Make things move-in ready

7. Make sure the pastor's office is clean and ready.

#### Continue the welcome during the entry period

- 8. Give gift cards to several of your favorite restaurants or places when you shop in the community. Place them in a basket so that they may be all presented at once.
- 9. Give the pastor and family a welcome reception on the first Sunday.
- 10. Continue to remember your new pastor and family in your daily prayers.

#### Help the new pastor become familiar with the congregation

- 11.Introduce yourself to the pastor repeatedly! You have one name to learn; your pastor has many names to learn. Once your new pastor arrives, make sure to offer your name in each greeting for the first few weeks. Learning names is important for pastors.
- 12. Wear name tags. Even if name tags are not a tradition, the congregation can wear them for a few weeks to help the pastor learn names.
- 13. Provide an up-to-date list of all church committees and officers.
- 14. Provide the new pastor with a tour of where things are kept inside the church and perhaps a floor plan of the facilities.
- 15. Orient the new pastor to information systems and the way records are kept.
- 16.Make sure the pastor has a list of home bound or nursing home members, a list of those struggling with long term illness, and a list of those still in grief over recent deaths in the family. Better yet, take the pastor for an introduction to each of these households.
- 17. Have an appropriate person offer to go with the pastor for introductions and support if there are particularly urgent pastoral situations (a member near death or the family of a member who has just died).

#### Help the new pastor connect to the community

- 18. Provide local media with information about the new pastor.
- 19.Introduce your new pastor to other clergy in the community. Provide information on any ecumenical activities or associations.
- 20. Introduce the new pastor to public and community leaders.

Most importantly, pray for the new pastor. And let her know that you are praying
