

Above the Ceiling

Summertime! And the living is...

Easy?!?!!! With 100 degree plus temps stretching as far as you can see and the humidity already a fine soup at 6:00 in the morning, easy is not the first word that comes to mind. After the unusually hard rain and cooler temps that stretched from April through June, some of us forgot momentarily what the true South Texas summer is really like.

If you are still in the recovery process of rooftop and mini split condenser coils that got hammered from the hail that rolled through, your troubles may not quite be over. And if those damaged coils (that have already lost much of their ability to reject heat) are dirty, these higher temps can push head pressures into the red zone. And heaven forbid a condenser fan decides to go belly up...

And so, there is work to be done on the roof. It might, be you, might be a contractor, but it is hot out and it's not taking care of itself. So, use sunscreen, wear light weight, light colored clothing and a wide brimmed (what Alfred would call "an old man hat"). Pace yourself, take regular breaks (in AC if possible), use fans or ice towels. Whether on the job or at the house or, if you're working in the heat, drink plenty of water (possibly supplementing with a sports drink), try to work in the morning and stay in the shade if possible.

Pay attention to signs of heat stress like confusion, dark urine (sign of dehydration), dizziness, fainting, fatigue, headache, muscle cramps and nausea. Remember that a high relative humidity (like we have here in South Texas) hinders the ability of the body to cool itself by perspiration and this is compounded when we are in bright sunshine (like on a TPO roof while working on an AC unit). Know that certain health conditions (among these obesity, high blood pressure and diabetes) can make you more susceptible to heat-related stress; these and some other conditions may make you likely to underestimate your ability to tolerate the heat!

Some medications (among these diuretics, sedatives, heart and blood pressure meds) may also affect your ability to cope with extreme heat and humidity. Know also that if you have experienced a heatstress event, that your body may take a week or longer to recover; avoid stressing it more during this time.

Remember how when you were young and invincible and didn't worry about anything? Heat stress is one of those things that can sneak up on you, so be ready for it. And don't forget about that Contractor changing out the compressor while you are in your air conditioned building; is someone checking on him? Aint no Superman out there when it comes to fighting the sun and we all need to look out for each other.


