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Parish Council News

The July Meeting

Sydenham Grove Appeal

Responses to the appeal were lodged with the Inspector by 11th July and the Parish Council have submitted their response together with the presentation made to the planning committee. Villagers have been encouraged both individually and via Sydenham Mail to respond and hopefully a number of you have, as there is strength in numbers.

SSE Undergrounding project

The project has stalled as SSE is awaiting approval of new highway access to install the switchgear.

Speeding/VAS

Installation of the replacement Vehicle Activated Sign on the B4445 is progressing although there are a few issues with highways to be resolved. We are also progressing with the purchase of a car to be used as a mobile pinch point.

Playing field

We are expecting a ROSPA inspection this month and any problems highlighted will, as always, be rectified.

The summer months tend to see some anti-social behaviour on the playing field involving non-villagers. A recent incident has been reported to our PCSO who has reiterated that incidents need to be reported as they are happening on 101 by villagers and the police will attend if possible. Retrospective reporting is not effective.

The new A frame is complete with a wonderful bespoke seating area underneath which sadly has been vandalised. The new A frame was funded mainly by a donation from Sydenham Fayre with the balance met by the Parish Council. What a shame that a village funded asset in our playing field has been subjected to anti-social behaviour.

Potholes and road drainage

Villagers are urged to report problems on Fix my street, https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/, the more reports on an issue the better. The PC does **not** have any other method to report problems on the Highways.

The blocked underground pipe outside Byre House has been replaced whilst the recent Thames Water road closure was in operation. We await rain to test the result!

Neighbourhood plan

A Consultant has been commissioned to help the neighbourhood plan group, and grant funding obtained to pay these costs. A walk around assessment has been undertaken with the consultant to look at the character of buildings in the village. There will be another village meeting in the near future to advise on progress and explain the slightly different approach that has been advised. A Sydenham mail message will be sent to advise on the date.
