New year = new possibilities, so welcome 2022. You have already heard from 1st VC Martinez that we are moving right along with membership. We are slightly behind the projected goals but, by the time you read this, about 2/3 of our members will have renewed and invested in our Post and our future. Thank you very much. If you are among the small number who have not renewed your membership, you are now delinquent. Please come in to the Post and see one of the officers or the bartender, or just pay online by going to Le-gion.org and clicking on the renewal tab. You can even print your membership card right there.

Why do we make such a fuss about membership every year? Your Post is a two-part entity. There are the Legion operations and the club operations. These two parts require very careful oversight to remain properly balanced. I want to recognize the hard work that your Executive Board and especially your Finance Officer, Susan Wood does to keep our Post moving in a positive direction. Without that leadership we would have been in real trouble during the pandemic shutdown. Right now, we are financially stable. With the help from rental of the hall, the club, the donations from caring members, our Auxiliary, SAL and Riders family and your dues, we are stable. The problem is, we live in a 100-yr old house and that house needs some serious care. Floors, plumbing, windows, electrical all need a facelift. Your dues play an important role but we need all hands renewed so that dues dollars can go to regular operational expense and we can use the generous donations to fund major projects and maintenance.

You may not know how your dues are spent. Let's take a look. For every renewal, we must pay our per capita or "per member' costs to our higher HQs first, just like taxes. This is that breakdown:

Member Dues National Per capita	- \$45.00 - \$18.50
Dept of CA Per capita District 29 Per capita	- \$15.00
Post Share	50c - \$11.00

Our membership goal for 2021/2022 is 545 members. As I write this article, we have 369 renewed so far. The math from here is easy. If every member renews and we meet our 100% goal, we get \$5,995 in dues to run our non-club operations. Did anyone else wince when you saw that number? Right now, with 369 renewals, we only have \$4,059 to pay our bills and keep the lights on. I couldn't pay the property tax on my home with that money and you can bet that we can't either here at your Post without your generous support and your renewals. Please renew this weekend. Get current, get involved and enjoy your Post.

Enough with the heavy stuff. It is time to spotlight another volunteer. The next time you are at the Post on a Sunday morning for breakfast, say hello to Jorge Carbajal. He will probably be doing a messy or unpopular task, but he will have his characteristic smile on his face. Jorge isn't an officer; he is a member who is there making a difference by helping out. Jorge, thank you for your dedication and your service. We can use all the help that folks can muster so come on down. It is fun, rewarding and really doesn't take a lot of time.

STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL



Harold Arlington Watson was born on February 7, 1899 in Orange. He was the 5th and final child born to Jonathan Watson, a local fruit grower, and his wife Lenna Barger Watson.

At the age of 18, Jonathan began service in the Army on April 9, 1917, during the 3rd year of World War I. He honorably served until April 16, 1919 as part of the 160th Infantry Regiment, 40th Infantry Division.

During World War I, his regiment participated in the French Meuse-Argonne Offensive in 1918 and the Battle of St. Mihiel. During the Meuse-Argonne Offensive, units of the 160th Regiment, along with units of the 307th Infantry Regiment, became known as the "Lost Battalion."

In 1918, Harold married Bernice Wilbur, the stepdaughter of an Orange general practitioner Doctor. Together Harold and Bernice had five children from 1919 to 1928. At least one of Harold's sons, Wilbur Watson

(1926-2000), continued his father's military legacy by serving as a Marine during World War II.

Sometime around 1941, Harold and Bernice divorced, and at the age of 42, he married Attie Thomas, 36. Together they had a son. According to his selective service registration (aka The Old Man's Draft) by 1942. Herold was 43 years old and working at

Draft), by 1942, Harold was 43 years old and working at the National Supply Company in Torrance.

Harold passed away March 8, 1950, at the far too young age of 51. We don't know the cause of death, but we do know he had at least one grandson at the time. Ultimately he had several great grandchildren. He's interred in Anaheim Cemetery. We thank you for your service and commitment, Corporal Harold Arlington Watson.
