



HUNGRY?

The past few months of the vear have been filled with so many opportunities to eat! First the football games (go Bills!), with copious snacks and pizza and wings. Then Halloween candy; then Thanksgiving, with an embarrassment of food and desserts. All through December we bake and eat Christmas cookies, and on the eve and day of the holiday itself, the table is spread heavily with all our favorites. Then we cap it off when we eat (and drink) to celebrate the New Year. The average American gains 5-10 pounds, and the most common New Year's resolution is to lose weight.

BUT, more than 11% of U.S. households (about 37.2 million people) don't know where their next meal is coming from; for 12 million, that meal won't come at all. 12.6 million people skip meals or don't eat enough, just to stretch the available food. And these abysmal statistics are actually an improvement from 10 years ago. But now there is legislation pending that would eliminate 700,000 people from the food stamp program.

Who is most vulnerable? The LGBTO community, singleparent households, the elderly, people with health crises, anyone facing job discrimination.

Responding to hunger has been part of the church's work since its beginning. Acts 6 describes how the early church organized food distribution to the community. In 1 Corinthians, Paul scolds the church at Corinth for neglecting hungry people. In the Lutheran tradition. Martin Luther felt that separating worship from service work would be a denial of the Gospel. This year, ELCA World Hunger supported more than 70 ministries across the U.S. and Caribbean. Some provide food, some do vocational training, others plant community gardens. Your Synod Mission Support makes this possible. Thanks be to God for your generosity! 

Pastor's message..

Walking with Jesus into a new year and new decade...

Luke 24:28-35 "As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. They were saying, "The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!" Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread."

One of my favorite Jesus stories in the Bible is the account of the Emmaus Road. Two disciples are walking along what seems to be a lonely road, returning to Emmaus after the

incidents of Jesus arrest, crucifixion and death in Jerusa-



lem. While the disciples had heard rumors that the tomb Jesus had been buried in was empty, they had not seen the risen Christ with their own eyes – yet. Along the way, Jesus with his identity somehow hidden from the disciples joins them on their long seven mile walk home. The disciples are despondent, dejected and having a crisis of faith. How could it be that their leader is dead and gone? What was the purpose of all the things Jesus taught them, if now he's suddenly left them to live life as business as usual? While they are walking on a road, they seem to me to wandering for a sense of purpose and direction – now that Jesus is gone. But, as he so often does. Jesus surprises his followers with his presence.

A friend of mine had a surprising experience of Jesus being present, from a first-hand experience. She had always been interested in Christianity, but it was more of an intellectual in-

terest more than one of believing in Jesus. She would ask be what seemed to be neverending questions about Jesus every time we got together and talked. Her intellectual interest even prompted her to attend a book club with a group of Christian women. Week after week she would take time to read the book, come to group and ask lots of questions. At times. I would have to encourage the rest of the group to be patient with my intellectual friend. While she had a great deal of facts and ideas about Christians, she really was not familiar with church culture or traditions. While you can read a book about something and learn aspects about the subject, it falls short from living into an actual place, experience or with a group of people. Over time, my friend became a part of this small but eclectic assembly of Christian women and what was once only head knowledge became more tangible because of her experience with us. As she saw for herself, being a part of a community of faith in Christ isn't perfect, but it's perfectly amazing because Christ is with

Early one morning, the day after book group, my friend called me on the phone. There was excitement and a bit of confusion in her voice. She was shouting quite loudly, so I had to ask her to slow down so I could understand her. She replied, "Jesus was there all along!!!!"

I was confused by her statement and asked her to explain.

Apparently, over the weeks she attended the book group, my friend – who is very intelligent - wasn't only asking questions. She was listening. She was watching. She was paying attention to how we treated each other. She was witnessing care and love for each other as we shared life's challenges and had been overcome with emotion as we prayed for one another each week. In our small actions of care and faith in Christ - she had witnessed the presence of Christ in our little book group. My friend, resistant to the truth that Jesus is with us, came to recognize Christ's presence in our fellowship. While we may have taken it for granted, she

- Small stones
- Permanent markers
- Foil pan and cooking spray
- Drop cloth
- Gloves
- Quick-set concrete (and adult help)
- Bucket and paint stirrer

What you do:

- 1. After reflecting on the past year, use markers to decorate stones with memorable words, dates and drawings.
- 2. Spray pan with cooking spray. Set pan outside on a drop cloth.
- 3. Wearing gloves, mix concrete in a bucket, according to instructions.
- 4. Pour concrete into pan. Smooth top with paint stirrer.
- 5. Press in stones, handprints and other decorations.
- 6. Let dry completely. Remove from pan.
- 7. Place the stepping-stone outside as a reminder of God's continued goodness.

could not. While we had heard and experienced the good news of Jesus Christ, this was the first time that Jesus was more than knowledge or data for her – *Jesus Christ was there all along!*

We all have Emmaus Roads to walk. We are not sure if we will settle in Emmaus or head back to Jerusalem. Our names may not be Peter or John, but we are disciples of Jesus Christ. As we walk, there are times that we start to believe that we are alone on the road. We wonder if the times we felt Jesus presence were truly real and we wish for Jesus to come and break bread with us once again.

The truth is, that Jesus Christ IS with us – all along. The truth is – that Jesus Christ will break bread with us once again, and again as we all gather at the altar for Communion. Where the Word and the elements are given – we find Jesus.

We all are like the disciples on the Emmaus Road. We are also like my questioning friend looking for answers. We long to be close to Jesus – but we are unsure how to achieve that presence. The truth is, we can't do anything to achieve that presence – it isn't our place to
