In today's Gospel, Jesus highlights two points ■ in his teaching. First, drawing on the example of the scribes who "like to walk around A in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces", Jesus clearly cautions his own disciples, and us too, against the dangers of hypocrisy - of manifesting external piety without truly surrendering our hearts to God.



Then Jesus points to the poor widow who, with her contribution of "two small copper coins" to the treasury, "put in everything she had, all she had to live on". Jesus upholds the poor widow's offering, commending her because her small offering was an act of profound generosity, given from her livelihood rather than her surplus. To give from one's livelihood is not only an act of generosity but also an act of total dependence on God. Today we are called to give more generously of our time, our talent, and our treasury, following the poor widow's example of 'sacrificial giving' and following Jesus' ultimate act of generosity and trust in God, giving his life for us on the Cross.

NOVEMBER 11 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT MARTIN OF TOURS, BISHOP: Martin, born to pagan parents, became a Christian catechumen and was baptized at 18 years of age. Later he pursued his vocation as a monk. He was joined by disciples and together they founded the first monastery in Gaul (France). In 371 he was proclaimed Bishop of Tours by the people. He served as a bishop-monk and converted pagans to the faith until his death in 397. He is usually depicted on horseback, offering his cloak to a poor man. Martin is a patron of France, soldiers, and vintners.



**NOVEMBER 11 - REMEMBRANCE DAY:** Today Canadians pause in silence to remember those who died in war and to pray for the victims of aggression and inhumanity throughout the world. This is a day also to pray for peace, to consider what we are doing as individuals, as a community, and as a nation to bring God's peace into the world. It is a day too for a believing community to rededicate itself by prayer and action to the ideals Jesus gives us in the Beatitudes (Matthew 5.1-12).

NOVEMBER 12 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT JOSAPHAT, BISHOP, MARTYR: John Kuncewicz chose the name 'Josaphat' upon entering the Order of St. Basil. He was ordained a priest of the Byzantine rite in 1609 and soon gained renown for his preaching. In 1617 he was named Archbishop of Polotsk, Russia, and he worked for the renewal of the Diocese and for the union of the Ukrainian Church with Rome. In 1623 he was slain by opponents, and in 1867 he became the first Eastern saint to be formally canonized.
