Lighthouse Quilt Guild General Meeting Minutes

Oct 31, 2017 at 7 PM

Pat Henningfeld called the meeting to order. (Note: Neither copresident was available to run the meeting.)

Announcements: Guests were introduced.

Rachel Riley has items remaining from the Quilt Show Boutique on tables at the side of the room to sell or return to the maker.

Program: Carol Butzke "The care and feeding of quilts"

Judy Martin introduced our speaker Carol Butzke. Carol gave an informative lecture on how to care for your quilts.

The best thing you can do is to use common sense. For handling quilts there are two schools of thought. Either wear gloves or have clean hands. The best way to store your quilts is flat on a bed with a sheet or acid free tissue paper between quilts. You can store in an acid free box with buffered or unbuffered acid free tissue paper. She demonstrated with a quilt how to do this. Diagonal folding of quilts is out as the bias stretches. Rolling on a tube is questionable. She discussed various ways to clean your quilts and how to decide what to do. For repair and conservation, she recommended a book by Ann Wasserman (http://www.annquilts.com). She also talked about shipping and insuring your quilts. She then showed 3 quilts and answered questions for the audience.

Business:

Pat Henningfeld talked about the mini-grant being used at Gifford School to sew pillowcases. Ginger Wanserski stated that the schedule is all set for next years programs and will go on the website soon. Jackie Tomkins gave a quilt show recap, recognized winners, special award winners, and the quilt show board. She noted that raffle ticket sales and boutique sales were up. Jackie gave some preliminary numbers for profits and attendance. T.C. reported that the vendors were happy.

Pat Henningfeld had the new members to the 2018 board stand.

The Hospitality committee introduced themselves. Checks for the Christmas party are being collected tonight by Dianna Zimmerman.

The spotlight quilter was Kristen Wengert. The Birthday bag drawings were for Oct and Nov birthdays. Regular door prizes were awarded.

REQUEST FOR FOSTER KIDS QUILTS

About 5 years ago, several Lighthouse Guild members (and a few helpers) began making quilts for Racine County Foster kids. To date we have made over 100 quilts for these deserving kids. The lists that we get from the Racine County Human Services office continue to get longer and longer, so it is time to ask for help.

Our quilts range from baby sized (40x40) to large lap (no bigger than 55x70). Each quilt gets a personalized 16"x 20" pocket on the back for the foster child's personal belongings.

What are we asking for from the guild? Quilts for boys and girls ranging from baby to large lap with an extra piece of fabric that coordinates with the backing. The piece of fabric should be big enough for the pocket -- a 16×20 inch front with a backing piece as well. The original group of quilters will handle the embroidered personalization as well as attaching it to the guilt.

If you are a domestic or long arm quilter and want to donate your skills in that way, we would love to take advantage of that too.

NOTE from QUILTS FOR THE COMMUNITY: the slip of paper that gets attached to a donated quilt will be changed for 2018 to add Foster Kids to our list of places. Specific sizes will always be included in our monthly article for Cot Quilts, Operation Snuggles, and Foster Kids. Let's work together to literally make all of these quilts for all of the community's children!


