

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING  
REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING  
March 6, 2019

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Grover Pryor called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Trustees present: Holly Martinson, Gina Schroeder, Jason Wikberg, Leo Pesch, Dave Sammons, and Erik Woog. Staff present: Police Chief Jaime Lucas, Public Works Director Jason Bock, and Interim Town Clerk Joanna Eaton.

SAMMONS MOVED TO APPROVE THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 20, 2019. MARTINSON SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

WOOG MOVED TO APPROVE EXPENDITURES DATED FEBRUARY 21 THROUGH MARCH 6, 2019 FOR A TOTAL OF \$109,562.50. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SCHROEDER MOVED TO APPROVE THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED. WIKBERG SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Mayor Pryor swore in Joanna Eaton as the temporary Town of Kremmling Clerk.

The Police Chief reported:

- New officer in hiring process, it could take a couple more weeks.
- Lucas does see and understand there is a need of more police presence and patrolling.
- Lucas will be attending a five-day class in Las Vegas, on Human Trafficking. The class will be paid by a scholarship he received. Officer Minhas also received a scholarship to attend a class for the evidence room.
- Lucas would also like to host an open house for the police department when the new town manger arrives.

Public Works Director reported:

- They will be keeping an eye on the water drainage.
- There is a lot of water running on the streets, but they have it under control.
- Otherwise everything else is in good shape.

There was no manger report

There was no Citizens Comments.

The Board of Trustees adjourned at 6:48 pm, and reconvened as the Liquor Authority for the Town of Kremmling.

SAMMONS MOVED TO ACCEPT THE REQUEST FOR THE SPECIAL EVENTS PERMIT FOR THE KREMMLNG CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FOR MARCH 30, MAY 5, JUNE 14 & JUNE 15, JULY 4, AUGUST 9 & 10, AND AUGUST 17. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SCHROEDER MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE LIQOUR LICENSE FOR THE GRAND ADVENTURE BREWING. WIKBERG SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

The Liquor Authority adjourned and reconvened as the Board of Trustees at 6:55 pm.

WOOG MOVED TO APPROVE ORDINANCE NO. 688, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 17 BY ADDING DEFINITIONS FOR IMPOUND LOTS AND OPEN STORAGE FACILITIES, AND ALLOWING THESE USES BY SPECIAL REVIEW WITHIN CERTAIN ZONE DISTRICTS. WIKBERG SECONDED. A roll call vote was taken. Mayor Pryor asked who was in favor of the Ordinance 688:

Ordinance 688 was passed 4-2

Mayor Pryor presented the 2019 Mosquito Control Contract. Dave Sammons mentioned he did get someone to give us the \$5,000 to do our mosquito study. Erik Woog has some commitments from the original contacts. They have donated almost \$20,000 as well. Sammons is concerned the town only has the funds for one aerial spray and would like to see one done around July 4<sup>th</sup>. The company is also looking for two people over the age of 18 to work full-time during the summer months. The contract was not signed at tonight's meeting, the board all agreed to get any questions together before signing the contract. The contract will then be brought up again at the next meeting.
