NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that pursuant to G.S. 163.33(8) a Municipal & Sanitary District Election will be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2017 in Wayne County to vote in the following contests and referendums:

- Sanitary Districts: Belfast-Patetown (5 seats), Eastern Wayne (5 seats), Southern Wayne (2 seats), Fork Township (3 seats), Southeastern Wayne (5 seats).
- Municipal: Village of Walnut Creek Councilman (2 seats), Town of Pikeville Mayor, Town of Pikeville Commissioner (2 seats), Town of Eureka Mayor, Town of Eureka Commissioner (2 seats), Town of Seven Springs Mayor, Town of Seven Springs Commissioner (2 seats), Town of Seven Springs Unexpired Term (1 seat), Town of Mount Olive Mayor, Town of Mount Olive Commissioner: At-Large, Districts 1-4.

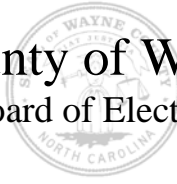
One-stop early voting will be held at the Wayne County Board of Elections office from October 19 - November 4 during the normal business hours of 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. and on Saturday, November 4 from 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. A full schedule is available at www.waynevotes.com. Canvass will be held in the Wayne County Board of Elections office at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, November 17.

Absentee voting by mail is available. Requests for an absentee ballot must be made on an absentee request form (available on the State Board of Elections website, at the county board of elections office and where one-stop early voting is offered), and must be received in the Wayne County Board of Elections office or any one-stop early voting site by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 31. Absentee voting requires the voter to complete an application on the return envelope that must be witnessed by two qualified persons or a notary public. Completed absentee ballots must be returned to the Wayne County

Board of Elections by 5:00 p.m. on Election Day (ballots received by mail after this time will be considered timely if they are received within three business days and postmarked on or before Election Day). Voters may receive assistance voting a mail-in absentee ballot from a qualified person of their choice. If the voter lives in a facility such as a nursing home, and the voter's near relative or legal guardian is not available, the voter or the facility may arrange to have the county board of elections schedule a visit by a Multipartisan Assistance Team to provide assistance and serve as witnesses.

All eligible persons who are registered to vote with the Wayne County Board of Elections may vote in this election. Persons who are **not** already registered to vote in the county must register by Friday, October 13 to be eligible to vote in this election. **Voters who are not registered in the county by that deadline** may register and vote during one stop early voting only, and will be required to provide documentation of their identity and residence. Voters who wish to change party affiliation or who have changed name or address must do so by the registration deadline. Voters who fail to timely make a change in name or address in the county must update the information when presenting to vote, and may be required to vote a provisional ballot.

Voters voting in person are entitled to assistance by an election official, or, if assistance is needed due to disability or illiteracy, by a qualified person of their choice. Voting sites are accessible to all voters. Curbside voting is available for voters who are not able to enter voting sites.
