#### **Bingo De Mayo**

#### **Bingo Hall Hero**

#### **Dear Aunt Bingo:**

There is an elderly woman who plays Bingo at a Bingo game where I volunteer. She has been coming here for years because the Bingo is a short walking distance from her home and she has known many friends here over the years.

My guess was that she was in her late 80s or maybe even older. Due to her advanced age, this past year she had really begun to struggle to play Bingo—the caller, the monitors, the paper, everything seemed to be giving her trouble.

Unintentionally, she started to disrupt the games by calling out when she didn't hear a number or had some other difficulty. This became bothersome for a growing number of players who felt,

understandably, that this lady's behavior was intruding more and more on their wish to have an enjoyable evening of Bingo.

There were a number of conversations between our manager, some workers and some players on what to do about this woman. Finally, one night I saw firsthand what had been decided: The manager met the woman at the front door, basically told her that Bingo was closed to her, and sent her on her way.

It broke my heart. All I could think was that this lady, who was probably already isolated, was losing yet another opportunity for social interaction. I ran over to the manager and asked if it was OK for me to sit with the lady and help her play. His relieved smile told me he felt just as bad about sending the lady away as I did witnessing it. He agreed to give it a try.

I ran outside and invited the lady back. Without the slightest hint of anger or hurt feelings, she thanked me, returned to the Bingo hall, bought her Bingo paper and settled into a seat. When Bingo started, I took the seat next to her and told her I'd sit with her to help with any difficulties.

It worked like a charm. At first, whenever she missed hearing a number, she would lean in and quietly ask me what it was and I'd tell her. Eventually I stopped waiting for her to ask and simply repeated each number to her as it was called. It was the only help she needed. She was quite able

to search and daub the correct numbers on her own.

There was also an unexpected side benefit to helping the woman play. I received a lot of smiles from appreciative players, a few pats on the back, and someone even brought me a soda. I couldn't get over how many people my small deed was affecting.

Now, every week, either I or another worker steps in to help this lady play. By the way, I found out her name is Elizabeth, she's 91 years old, she is a retired high school math teacher, and she bakes killer macaroons.— **WT**, **Ohio.** via email

#### Dear WT:

Congratulations! You are my new favorite person!

Stepping in to help Elizabeth was such kind gesture. Thank heavens you were at the right place at the right time to witness this wrong of sending her away and make it right. Plus, it was so touching to see the positive effect your kindness had on so many people around you. Hopefully, they all paid it forward with good deeds of their own.

Research has shown that Bingo is great for seniors not only for socialization but also for enhancing hand-eye coordination, boosting cognitive abilities, accelerating healing and recuperation, and improving overall physical health.

Bingo sponsors would be smart to market their games to seniors for all these reasons, and to have folks like you on hand to assist players like Elizabeth who want to play Bingo, are able to do so, but have some challenge—such as hearing the caller clearly or seeing the ball monitors—that requires minor assistance.



#### **An Early Fold is** Sometimes the **Best Move**

By Jonathan Little

Sometimes it just doesn't make sense to pay to see a flop, particularly when you see aggression from a normally passive opponent.

In a \$3/\$5 no-limit hold 'em cash game, a tight, straightforward player with a chip stack of \$300 limped from first position. Everyone folded around to our Hero, who raised to \$35 from the button with Ah Qd.

I am fine with Hero's raise, especially if he thinks the limper is unlikely to slow-play a premium hand in an attempt to trap. Raising frequently results in the opponent either just calling or folding with an inferior hand, allowing Hero to extract significant value with what is often the best hand at the moment.

But neither of those things happened this time. The blinds folded, and the initial limper reraised to \$100. Hero called.

When facing a limp/reraise, Hero should fold all but the most premium hands unless he is confident that his opponent is the sort of player who will occasionally get way out of line with his betting. Even if Hero thinks his opponent might be semi-bluffing with, say, Ah 5h or Jd 10d, Hero should still fold.

Based on track record, it's likely that this opponent was the type of

player who would be happy to win a small pot with his best hands because he is deathly afraid of getting outdrawn. Do not fall in love with your hand just because it is fairly strong and you are getting decent pot odds while in position. If your opponent's range consists of only A-A, K-K and Q-Q, folding is the only play that makes sense.

If instead of being tight and straightforward, the opponent was loose, active and maniacal, Hero should have gone all in, ideally making the opponent fold any hand that would win less than 50 percent of the time against A-Q.

The flop came Js 10d 6c. Hero's opponent pushed all in, betting his remaining \$200.

While a gutshot straight draw with overcards is normally a decent hand (because it has roughly 10 outs against top pair), it is far from an ideal hand in this situation. Hero will lose to all big pairs, as well as A-K and A-J. The only semirealistic hand that he is ahead of is K-Q, and almost no one limp/ reraises K-Q. Instead of having 10 somewhat live outs, Hero most likely has only four or seven outs, since his hand is likely to be dominated in some way.

This should have been an easy fold for Hero, given that he was getting only 2-to-1 pot odds. He needs to win 33 percent of the time for a call to make sense, and unless the opponent is a lunatic, Hero will only win in this spot about 25 percent of the time.

Hero called. His opponent showed Ks Kd. The turn and river blanked, and Hero lost a huge hand.

Against a player who had shown conservative tendencies earlier in the game, folding before the flop would have avoided what proved to be a costly mistake.

#### **What's New in Nevada**

#### The Fate of SLS Las Vegas

Alex Meruelo, a Reno-based entrepreneur says he will invest up to \$100 million to try to bring back to life the flagging SLS Las Vegas. Reports from his group say that Meruelo will "make the property profitable by investing in the upgrades and redesign." There are rumors that he may revive the old "Sahara" name, which is currently owned by another company.

#### **Chinese New Year Boost**

Records keepers say that because the Chinese New Year fell in February this year and not in January, for two months in a row Nevada's statewide gaming win was over the billion-dollar mark. Amid all of this, sportsbooks continue to be the big winners. For a four-year period, success in that sector has been on the upswing on a monthto-month basis.

#### **Nye County On A Roll**

Nye County, Nevada—a large county to the north and west of Las Vegas (it's largest city is Pahrump)—seems to be riding a hot streak as far as gaming revenues are concerned. The numbers have been on a general upswing since last summer. As this year began, gaming wins rose by 1.85 percent over the same time last year.

#### **Small Bet, Big Money**

Local media in Las Vegas recently reported that a woman placed a \$3.75 bet on a slot machine at the Orleans Hotel and Casino and won a jackpot valued at \$620,000. The payoff came in the middle of the night on a machine called Aristocrat's Buffalo Grand. The lucky winner was a "local," but her identity was not announced.

# Seven Playing Tips

Here are seven tips to help you play smarter in the casino.

(1) Since the casino has the mathematical edge on all bets, it's best to play games s-l-o-wl-v to reduce the total amount of money wagered. You can do this at blackjack by playing on full tables rather than alone against the dealer (fewer hands played per hour). At craps, use the Five Count method of play (eliminates about half the shooters). When playing mini-baccarat, wait for a player to win on the bank hand before wagering. At slots, pause briefly between each spin and take frequent breaks. The slower you play, the less you expose your bankroll to the house edge.

(2) Never play a progressive slot machine with less than max coins wagered. The only reason to play

a progressive slot machine is to chase the big jackpot. If you aren't going to play maximum coins, then you should play a different slot machine. Otherwise, you might be in a state of shock if you hit the jackpot symbols on a progressive machine and instead of winning the 6 or 7 figure jackpot, you end up winning hundreds or thousands instead. Likewise, you should always play max coins on a buy-a-pay machine where the jackpot symbols are only activated with the third coin played.

(3) You can always tell if a video poker machine is worth playing by looking at the payoff schedule on the machine. For example, for a jacks-or-better (draw poker) game, ideally the single coin payoff for the full house and flush should be 9/6 respectively (these machines return 99.54% with perfect play). Every decrease by one in either the full house or flush single coin payoff decreases the return by roughly 1.1%. So an 8/6 pay schedule would return only 97.3%. Be smart and check the pay schedules before you play.

(4) You are playing blackjack and you have a 16 against a dealer upcard of 10. You say under your breath, "Ahh, shoot," but you've still got to make a play. But what's best, to stand or hit? Depends. If the casino offers surrender, then surrender is your best play. If surrender is not available then you are slightly better off hitting rather than standing. One exception: If your 16 is made up of 3 (or more) cards, then standing is the better play.

(5) Many novice craps players like to wager on the Big 6 and 8.

The rules for winning are simple. If you bet on the Big 6, you win if 6 is rolled and lose if instead a 7 is rolled (same rules for Big 8). You can make the same bet in craps that pays more! Where? Make a Place bet on 6 or 8. A winning 6 or 8 Place bet pays 7-6, whereas a winning Big 6 or 8 bet pays only 1-1 (or even money).

(6) There are two ways to lower the house edge against you at roulette. The first way is to play roulette on wheels that have only a single 0 number as opposed to the single and double zero. The second way is to play roulette where the rules specify that if the ball lands on zero or double zero the player loses only half his wager on any even-money wager (e.g., odd/even; red/black/ or high/ low). The house edge is reduced about 50% in both cases, which in the long run will save you a considerable amount of money.

(7) Blackjack players will gladly accept the casino's offer for "even money" when they have a blackjack and the dealer shows an ace. That's because they figure the even money payout is a sure thing especially if the dealer winds up with blackjack. However, accepting even money is a big mistake. In the long run you will earn slightly more than even money when you decline the even money proposition. Play smart and never take even money.



I have selected several very good recipes that I am sure will impress your in-laws. If possible, try each recipe at least once before they come for their visit. The chicken recipe should be grilled. Hopefully the weather in your area will be okay for barbecuing. Good luck! — **Annie** 

#### SHRIMP QUICHE

1 pound fresh or frozen shrimp, peeled and deveined

½ can beer

2 tablespoons Old Bay Seasoning (crab & shrimp boil)

1 unbaked pie shell (9 inch)

3 eggs

1 cup half and half cream

1 cup grated Swiss cheese

 $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon pepper

3/4 cup chopped onion4 tablespoons butter

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Bring one quart of water, ½ can beer and Old Bay Seasoning to a boil, add the shrimp and boil for approximately 5 minutes or until the shrimp are pink; drain the shrimp. In a large bowl, mix the eggs, cream, cheese, salt and pepper. Mix well. Sauté onion in butter until soft. Add the onions to the egg mixture along with the shrimp. Reserve some shrimp for garnish. Pour into the pie shell and bake for 40 to 45 minutes. Serves 6.

#### **CHICKEN ALA ANNIE**

2 chicken fryers, cut-up (approximately 3 pounds each)

1 ½ cups soy sauce

½ cup honey

2 large garlic cloves, minced 2 cans (8 ounces) crushed pineapple

Wild rice or rice pilaf for 4

Mix the soy sauce, honey, minced garlic and pineapple in a covered dish large enough for the chicken. Add the chicken pieces and marinate overnight. Remove from the refrigerator at least one hour before cooking. Grill the chicken for 35 to 45 minutes or until well done. Serve with the wild rice or rice pilaf. Serves 8.

#### 10 Ways Seniors Can Avoid Identity Theft

#### Dear Savvy Senior,

What can seniors do to protect themselves from identity theft? My brother-in-law, who's 77, recently had his identity stolen and I want to make sure it doesn't happen to me. — **Worried Relative** 

#### Dear Worried,

Great question! Each year around 17 million people fall victim to identity theft, which happens when someone gets access to your Social Security number, bank or credit card account number, or other identifying information and uses it to steal from you. Here are some free steps you can take to reduce your risks.

Guard your personal information: Never give your Social Security number, credit card number, checking or savings account numbers to anyone unless you initiate the contact. Also, do not carry your Social Security card around in your wallet or purse, and don't carry around your Medicare card either unless you're going to the doctor.

Get off mailing lists: Put a stop to preapproved credit-card offers, which is a gold mine for ID thieves. To do this visit optoutprescreen.com or call 888-567-8688 - they will ask for your Social Security number and date of birth. You can stop other junk mail at dmachoice.org, and reduce telemarketing calls at donotcall.gov.

Use strong passwords: To safeguard your personal data on your smartphone or tablet don't use a password that's easy to hack, like 1234 or 0000. Also, make your computer passwords more than 8 characters long, with uppercase and lowercase letters, numbers, and symbols like # and %, and use different passwords on different accounts. If it's hard to remember them, try a password manager service like dashlane. com, truekey.com or lastpass.com.

Be wary of unknown emails: Never click on links in emails from strangers, or those that claim to be from the Social Security Administration, IRS or other government agencies, or from your bank, phone or credit card company warning of a "problem." This can result in identity-stealing malware being installed on your computer. To protect your computer from malware, install antivirus software (see avg.com and avast.com for free options) and set up automatic security updates and full weekly scans.

**Secure your mail:** Empty your home mailbox quickly or buy a

locked mailbox to deter thieves. And mail outgoing payments from a U.S. Postal Service mailbox or the post office, not from your more vulnerable home mailbox.

Get safer credit cards: If you don't already have one, get an EMV chip credit card from your credit card provider. They're much more difficult for fraudsters to hack than magnetic strip cards.

**Shred unneeded documents:** Buy a crosscut
paper shredder so you can shred
all unneeded records, receipts,
statements, preapproved credit
offers or other papers you throw
out that has your financial or
personal information.


#### **Monitor your**

accounts: Review your monthly bank and credit card statements carefully, and see if your bank or credit card issuer offers free alerts that will warn you of suspicious activity as soon as it's detected. If they do, sign up for them or use eversafe.com, which will do it for you for a small fee.

Watch your credit: Check your credit report at annualcreditreport. com or call 877-322-8228. You can receive one free report a year from each of the three major credit bureaus (Equifax, Experian and TransUnion), so consider staggering your request so you can get one free copy every four months.

Set up security freezes: If you don't plan to apply for new credit, loans, insurance or utility services, freeze your credit reports so crooks can't open up new accounts in your name. Rules vary by state, but the \$5 to \$20 fee is waived if you're 65 or older, or show proof of past ID theft. Security freezes are set up at all three credit bureaus at equifax.com, experian. com and transunion.com.
