Hanks Bullies finished with 55 points; Cactus Johns #1, 54 points; and Hanks Bullies, 53 points.





DO YOU OWN THE HOCKEY??

The question has come up in the past, "Why doesn't the darter in the next court stay in his own court?" I think this a valid question which should have a valid answer. Opinions have been rendered but without a bona fide base. Basically the width of the dart court is the solution of the wide shooting darter.

A bit of background on the derivation of the hockey which is a raised strip of wood placed on the floor to prevent the shooters edging too near the board. Apparently about 1908 the brewery of S. Hockey & Sons, well known in Dorsett, Devon and Cornwall, used to deliver their beers in wooden crates exactly 3 feet long. In Portsmouth several pubs hit on the idea of putting three crates end to end to mark the throwing line, hence the origin of the phrase, "Toe the hockey." Tom Barrett, leading British darter in the late 60s and 70s, states "the hockey should be a clearly marked white line about three feet long." Present day darting mats used widely throughout England and the U.S. are two or three feet wide by ten feet long. Robert McLeod and Jay Cohen report USDA rules state the toe line is three feet long running parallel to the board. In Southern California the standard darting court is ten feet long by seven feet wide with a three foot rubber mat. The hockey is distinct on the mat and designates the throwing limits. The raised hockey illustrated



The dart player must stand behind the toe line. Both feet must be within the 3-foot-wide line. Many major championships use wooden "wings" to prevent players from going outside this

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

I would like to make a few comments on a recent Dayton Dart Association planned function and present some new ideas which could be beneficial to the DDA, the younger darters and the overall morale of the challenge team.

The annual Quad-City Challenge Dart Match held in Columbus November 18, 1984 hosted Columbus, Cleveland, Cincinnati and Dayton. Nine teams from each city competed in intermatch play and for our Dayton team it was a disaster. We finished dead last (1983 team was a close second to Cincinnati).

Our procedure for qualifying for this supposedly professional team is to pay one dollar, then throw 30 darts and take the highest scorers for the team. The money collected is used to buy shirts for the team. I don't know of any other sport that uses this type of qualification procedure. Picture someone hitting 30 golf balls and heading for the pro circuit. I hope it is evident to everyone that this is at best ridiculous. The new and the mediocre players who made up half of the team did the best they were equipped to do. I might suggest that these players attend some major open tournaments as well as some of our own local events and gain some experience in this type competition.

Challenge match invitations should be encouraged and accepted by our best players only, or not at all. Anyone who wants to find out how his or her game is progressing should play 10 games of 501 with Steve Smith or Billy Nicoll Jr., or one of the other more skilled darters.

Challenge match play should be assigned to one person, responsible for gathering the top players, selecting a team and finding private funding for shirts, etc. These events should be cost free to the DDA since all dues paying members do not have an active part in them.

I always encourage new players and if asked, I will be happy to teach or coach them along. But let's leave the challenge match to seasoned experienced players.

Also, I have a couple items that may be of interest to you.


First, what is the ADO and why we are members, and financing Dayton darters in the various national and world tournaments (see Financing and Interest Lacking in ADO Qualifiers).

Some of you know what the ADO is all about and then, again, some of you don't, so I'd like to give you a little rundown on what the American Darting Association does for you.

It was originally formed in 1975 by a few enthusiastic people. Their main concern was to establish standardized rules and equipment for national and international play for the darting population, and also to promote the sport of darts which they felt could be done by a greater number of people. Today, there are over 58 thousand members in the ADO. Listed below are just a few of the things the ADO has done for us as members:

FINANCING AND INTEREST LACKING IN ADO QUALIFIERS - By Steve Smith, ADO Rep

The DDA participation in the ADO qualifiers for national and world tournaments has not been anything to brag about. This past year we had only one representative from the DDA to go to the World Master's Qualifier in Springfield. We also didn't send anyone to represent us in the Pacific Cup or the All Star Team qualifiers. This is a shame because we have a lot of great darters in our organization.

Our main problem is money. It takes \$100 to send one individual to each of these qualifiers. These are very special events since they are made up of shooters such as you and I who qualify through local association playoffs. In prior years we have relied upon association playoffs alone to finance an individual or two. But since too few darters try and qualify, we are unable to afford to send representatives of the DDA. Here are a few suggestions that might be able to solve this problem.

First, I suggest we ask each individual member to donate a few dollars to go into a fund used only for the purpose of ADO national qualifier fund for our organization. The amount of money would be determined by how many qualifiers we wish to send to each

event. Then we could set up dates for qualifying rounds, anyone interested could try out for a particular event such as the World Master or the All Star Team, or the Pacific Cup.

Second, why not entire league participation. Again, so much money per member. Then have a team shoot off among each team member, then to a divisional playoff, onto a league championship match. This also can determine our representatives to the area qualifiers, and determine our divisional and league champion as well.


These are just a few ideas, but we would like to hear your comments, or suggestions, you may have. Give me a call, Steve Smith, at 879-5659.


Perhaps we can remedy this problem so that Dayton Darting Association will have someone to represent us in the next big ADO event.



WHO IS YOUR DIVISION REP?

It seems many darters are not aware of the organizational setup of the DDA and the link of communication between DDA members and the officers of the Association.

Team captains and division representatives, listed below, are the main cogs for relaying all information concerning association, division, or team affairs. Captains receive information from the division rep or directly from association officers to be disseminated to his team members. Division reps represent four to eight teams as a clearing house for individual or team problems and carrying out directives and instructions from association officers. Also, the district reps are your voice at the monthly DDA meetings (first Tuesday of every month, 8:00 PM, at the Kettering Government Center).

So if you have a problem to report, you need information, wish to report an outstanding darting performance, or need information from the association level, contact your captain or division rep.

Division reps were appointed at the start of the darting season. For your information all division reps and phone numbers are listed. Jot down your division rep for future reference.



DARTS IN AND OUT OF PLAY

Only darts penetrating the board on completion of a throw of three darts are scoring darts. The point of the dart must be in the board, or touching it, to score. Touching the board is a questionable decision which should be ruled out. Penetration should control. Darts which rebound from the board do not count. Nor does the dart which sticks in another dart. Darts which fall out of the board, or are knocked out by subsequent darts, do not score. Once the dart has been thrown past the toe line (hockey), it cannot be returned to the thrower for a second attempt. The question of whether or not a dart is sticking in the board is decided at the moment the thrower plucks his darts out of the board. Some rules require a five second period shall elapse from the time the last dart is thrown. You should, therefore, always go to the board as quickly as possible after completing a throw, particularly if one of the darts has been a light one. Many a trip 20 has fallen to the floor just because the thrower was slow to remove the arrows.

definitely defines the limits of the hockey.

Marking of the hockey in U.S. darting may be by a continuous strip of tape but it should not be inferred this is the line which a darter can roam to fire a shot.

The three feet referred to in the illustration has been the unwritten or unpublicized lateral limits for darting throws.

Moving laterally along the hockey requires adjustments in delivery which normally results in low shots. Of greater importance, it is annoying to darters in adjacent courts. There is also another good reason for limiting the hockey to three feet. It should not prevent any delays in the game and schedules can be met (especially in tournaments).

Perhaps we need to incorporate the three foot limit at the hockey in our league rules to eliminate some of the frustrations encountered in our weekly matches.

THE COURTESIES OF THE GAME

There are certain things which you should never do while playing darts, either in a friendly game or competition. It is bad manners when your opponent is throwing to:

- talk loudly, yell, laugh, utter disrupting sounds
- tell him what number he needs
- keep up a constant chatter with bystanders
- shuffle your feet
- fiddle with your darts in his view
- drop your darts
- stand in front of the hockey or side of dart court
- stare and glare in his face Other courtesies and manners to be practiced are:
 - never bump a darter at the hockey
 - if passing a shooting darter, wait until throw is completed unless there is ample space to the rear for walking
 - after disappointing throws do not throw darts at the board, walls, or doors
 - kicking or pounding the wall with your fist is strictly "bush"
 - keep your feet behind the hockey. Toes over the hockey is a violation and in

- some matches may be enforced to give you zero for the throw
- if keeping score (chalking), stand well off to the side of the board, look at the board at all times and do not make any motions. Keep your mind on scoring, calculate accurately the score and "brush up on your subtraction"

Also it is bad manners to:

- walk in front of the hockey
- throw objects across the playing area
- take unnecessary time in posting score or going to and returning from the scoreboard

Do maintain a three foot hockey limit and do not shoot from extreme right or left to annoy or delay adjacent shooters (in major competition exceeding the three foot limit is a foul).

This kind of gamesmanship is much more common than you think. His throw, to a darts player, is as sacrosanct as a putt is to a golfer. It should be respected. Besides I always say: "If you can't beat a man by fair means, there's no satisfaction in beating him foul!"
