### ALL SOULS' REMEMBRANCE

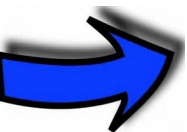

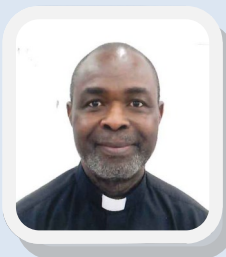

**Erroneous Judgment**  
§1790-1794

A human being must always obey the certain judgment of his conscience. If he were deliberately to act against it, he would condemn himself. Yet it can happen that moral conscience remains in ignorance and makes erroneous judgement about acts to be performed or already committed. This ignorance can often be imputed to personal responsibility. This is the case when a man "takes little trouble to find out what is true and good, or when conscience is by degrees almost blinded through the habit of committing sin." In such cases, the person is culpable for the evil he commits.

Ignorance of Christ and his gospel, bad example given by others, enslavement to one's passions, assertion of a mistaken notion of autonomy of conscience, rejection of the Church's authority and her teaching, lack of conversion and of charity: these can be at the source of errors of judgment in moral conduct.

If--on the contrary--the ignorance is invincible, or the moral subject is not responsible for his erroneous judgment, the evil committed by the person cannot be imputed to him. It remains no less an evil, a privation, a disorder. One must therefor work to correct the errors of moral conscience.

A good and pure conscience is enlightened by true faith, for charity proceeds at the same time "from a pure heart and a good conscience and sincere faith. The more a correct conscience prevails, the more do persons and groups turn aside from blind choice and try to be guided by objective standards of moral conduct.

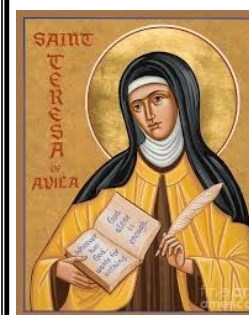

**ST. TERESA OF AVILA  
FEAST DAY  
OCTOBER 15**

St. Teresa lived in an age of political, social, and religious upheaval with some similarities to our own. It was the 16th century, a time of turmoil and reform. She was a woman in a male dominated society; she was a contemplative, a mystic and yet an active reformer in the age of the Inquisition when lack of conformity was not particularly appreciated. She was much misunderstood in her day. By way of example, she once commented that, "If you do something wrong, don't punish yourself -- change." And she did "change" things. She became determined to found a new convent that went back to the basics of a cloistered order and return it to the quiet, contemplative life so important to a close spiritual relationship with God. She reformed her order, our understanding of prayer and even the possibilities of our relationship with God. Her book, "The Seven Interior Castles," continues to inspire those who seek insight into the value and essence of prayer. She was declared one of three female "Doctors of the Church," as a saint who is recognized as having made significant contributions to theology or doctrine through their research, study, or writing. The others are St. Catherine of Sienna and St. Theresa of Lisieux. Saint Thérèse of Lisieux admired her greatly.

There will be a Pax Christi Meeting on Sunday, October 21, at 12:30 pm, in Classroom 6. The discussion of Chapters 1-5 of John Dear's book, "The Non-Violent Life," will continue from last month. The book is available from Pace e Bene Press. As always, all are welcome whether or not you have done the reading beforehand. For those who may not be familiar with Pax Christi, it is a Catholic group of international organizations whose work is based in spirituality. They work for a more peaceful, just and sustainable world through the efforts of their members and in collaboration with other groups. It is an anti-racist, multicultural, Catholic movement for peace with justice.
