

We are an emergency men's drop-in shelter for men who are 18 or older. Length of stay is 30 days with an ID. If they do not have an ID but they have a SSN, it will be verified and an ID will be provided for them. An extension is granted if the man has found employment and is close to securing his own apartment. There are no income guidelines and admission is by need only. Men must sign a "Host-Guest" agreement which requires them to obey all rules and complete one chore daily. Three meals per day are provided as well as clothing. Some opportunities for job placement are available on a limited basis. Monetary assistance (particularly for medicine) is through a referral to ROSM, St. Vincent DePaul Society or the Mission Clinic at First Baptist Church. Twelve (12) beds are available with additional room for up to 36 men by using cots and mats. Turnover rate is high due to residents moving on or moving out to their own apartments. Men are not turned away except for those with behavior problems or those on the Sex Offender Register. Lunch is provided for "whoever drops in" on a daily basis (365 days). NO CHARGE

Active Day of Frankfort is an adult day care center, located in Frankfort, KY 40601. Adult day care can give caregivers respite by providing a center where elderly parents can be taken for a couple of hours or the entire day and picked back up later. The day programs include social activities, meals and general elderly supervision.

For families that have had a serious or major loss (fire, flood, etc.). The Legion may provide up to \$200 per child with a max of \$800 per family for children's clothing needs. Children must be 17 or younger and other county resources must be utilized first.

We provide apartment living for elderly (55+ with possible exceptions for younger individuals) males and females without children who do not require nursing assistance. All meals and housekeeping are provided. No application required. Signing of "Rental Agreement" is required although rent is month-to-month. A 60-day notice is required to move out. A deposit equal to the amount of the first month is required with half for an administrative fee; the other half is a security deposit. Section 8 is not accepted. No apartment is set aside for homeless individuals. Please contact us for current rates.

(LIHEAP) assists low-income families with heating costs through April. Income requirements, ID, Social Security cards for all in household and second notice on heating bill required. Air conditioners provided in summer for those with health issues and the elderly.

<u>Senior Community Services Employment Program</u> gets 55+ persons back into the work force with job training. They are assigned to work in area non-profit agencies with salaries paid by federal funds. Max 20 hours per week @ minimum wage. In theory, employee/trainees are moved from one agency to another every 6 months or so and can remain in the program usually about 2 years, but in some cases up to 4 years.

<u>Senior Companion Program</u> is a program where senior citizens visit senior citizens in their homes to assist seniors to continue living on their own. Those visiting must be 60+ and fall within income guidelines. Call 502-695-4290

Bus Program offers free trips for Medicaid recipients, vocational rehab and Dept for the Blind. Public transportation available for a fee and you must call 72 hours in advance unless going to Urgent Care. Call 502-695-4290 and leave a voicemail message with your name & number and they will call you back to schedule pick up. Toll free 800-456-6588 will reach driver on a cell phone. ****Those with Medicaid can ride for free in Frankfort and can request trips for out of town doctor's visits. Hours of operation: M-F 8am – 4:30pm and Sat 8am – 1pm. After hours paging is available including Sundays and state holidays or for immediate or "urgent care" transportation.

<u>Weatherization Program</u> The goal is to help low income people make their dwelling more energy efficient by providing needed home repairs around windows and doors and repair or replacement of heating systems when necessary.

The CCC has long been referred to as the local hub for child care in Central Kentucky. The CCC's mission is to serve as a visible community resource committed to offering access to affordable, quality care and education. We pledge to promote, expand, and enhance services to improve the quality of life for all children, families, and early care professionals in the Bluegrass. CCAP is available to children under age 13, or up to age 19 if the child has special needs verified by a qualified health professional.

Eligible children must reside with a parent or parents who meet the following criteria:

- Teen parent who attends high school or is pursuing a GED;
- Parent is employed for an average of 20 hours per week; or
- Parent is enrolled in an education or training program and works for wages an average of 20 hours per week. NOTE: A parent who is involved for an average of 20 hours per week in an unpaid student activity including an internship, practicum or student teaching is exempt from the paid work requirement.
- Two parent families must combine an average of 40 hours per week with neither parent working less than an average of five hours a week unless one adult is verified as mentally or physically unable to provide care for the children. In instances where there is an incapacitated parent in the home the minimum work requirement for the non-incapacitated parent is an average of 20 hours per week. The incapacitated parent must provide a doctor's statement verifying that he/she is unable to care for the child.
- Parent receives K-TAP benefits and needs child care assistance to maintain employment or enrollment in an Education/training program consistent with employment goals & receives authorization from a DCBS worker.
- Parent has transitioned off K-TAP benefits within the past 12 months due to employment and the family's income does not exceed 165% of the federal poverty level and receives authorization from a DCBS worker;
- Parent who receives, or needs to receive, protective or preventive services.

"Every Day Matters" is an adult day care for those with decreased mental functions "Every Day Matters" accepts Medicaid and those without Medicaid pay a set amount monthly. Please contact us for current fees. Only available for disabled referred from Medicaid/accepted with Medicaid waiver. Other services include a caseworker/therapist to assist with the goal of self-sufficiency.
