Waskesiu is a seasonal community within Prince Albert National Park, approximately 100 km north of the city of Prince Albert. In the summer, the townsite fills with tourists and cabin and cottage owners enjoying recreation in the National Park. The Museum preserves the human history of Waskesiu from 1928, the year the Park opened.

Applications will be received until May 18, 2017

To be eligible, students must:

- be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment;
- have been registered as full-time students in the previous academic year and intend to return to school on a full-time basis in the next academic year;
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*; and,
- be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.
