IN MEMORIUM Rev. Glenn K. Miller December 11, 1955—September 20, 2015

Early on the morning of Sunday, September 20 many of us were awakened with the tragic news of the sudden death of our beloved Pastor Glenn. We gathered in worship that morning, beautifully led by our Lay Leader, Bev Adams, to remember his work among us and give thanks for the far-too-short time we were led by this dedicated man.

On September 25 the church was filled with family, friends, our congregation and many clergy as we gave praise for his ministry among us. The eulogy was given by Bishop John Schol of the Greater NJ United Methodist Church.

Pastor Glenn was very active in the Mount Misery Retreat Center for over 20 years. He was appointed to numerous churches in the NJ Conference, the last three years at Vincentown UMC. Prior to that he was pastor for seven years at Masonville-Rancocas UMC. All who knew him will always remember his abundant sense of humor.

His Study was Not Just an Office

Pastor Glen's study was a symbol of the calling of a Christian Minister to be a shepherd of a flock of God's people. There his sermons were prepared to feed the congregation with God's holy word.

There the work of the church was planned so the congregation could grow in grace and bear fruit in fellowship, in teaching and in witnessing.

There, especially, we could always find a friend and counselor in any time of need. He was neither surprised by our sins nor did he judge us for them, but he always invited us to share in the wisdom and love of God, the knowledge of the forgiveness of sins and the redeeming grace of God in Jesus Christ. In his study we were always welcome!

We remember in prayer his loving wife of 35 years, Jeanne; his mother, children and beloved grandchildren as well as his siblings and nieces. Although he was with us for too short a time, using the words of the Apostle Paul, he abounded in the work of the Lord and knew that, in the Lord, his labor was not in vain. Therefore, we remember him with deep thanksgiving before God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (I Corinthians 15:57-58)
