Leaving the wilderness?

In Joshua 1 we read:

After the death of Moses the servant of the Lord, the Lord said to Joshua son of Nun, Moses' aide: "Moses my servant is dead. Now then, you and all these people, get ready to cross the Jordan River into the land I am about to give to them—to the Israelites. I will give you every place where you set your foot, as I promised Moses. Your territory will extend from the desert to Lebanon, and from the great river, the Euphrates—all the Hittite country—to the Mediterranean Sea in the west. No one will be able to stand against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you. Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their ancestors to give them (vs. 1-6).

Think of it: wondering around the wilderness for 40 years! The children of Israel faced danger on every side. There were enemies, animals, lack of water, death, disobedience and the constant complaining? Sounds a little like the wilderness of Covid (but may it not be a 40 year struggle!) The good news is that the people, maybe best called survivors, finally, walked out of the wilderness and began to receive the inheritance that God had promised Moses. Glory, hallelujah!

It feels like we are beginning to walk out of the wilderness at First Church. It has been a difficult, challenging time the last 3 years, for all of us, for a variety of reasons, many associated with the pandemic. The church has had to adapt to what some are calling a "new normal.". This new normal may include less numbers physically present for worship, but it contains a large number of people present online. And this new normal is expressing itself with much stronger outreach ministry as well as our new youth group program. I am excited by these emphases. We are doing what God has called us to do – to reach out in His wonderful name!
