SERMON TITLE: "Do Gou Love Me"
SERMON TEXT: John 20:30 – John 21:19

1 Peter 5:1-4

## INTRODUCTION:

We ask questions for many reasons. I have often wondered "WHY" did Jesus ask Peter three times, "DO YOU LOVE ME?" --- What do you think? Did Jesus want to know? OR, did Jesus know? If so, then why?

AND, if Jesus knew the answer, what was Jesus trying to accomplish?

In Peter's life? In the lives of the other Disciples? In your life and my life?

## **JOHN 20:30 – JOHN 21:19**

Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book.<sup>31</sup> But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

21 Afterward Jesus appeared again to his disciples, by the Sea of Galilee. It happened this way: <sup>2</sup> Simon Peter, Thomas (also known as Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples were together. <sup>3</sup> "I'm going out to fish," Simon Peter told them, and they said, "We'll go with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

<sup>4</sup> Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus.

<sup>5</sup> He called out to them, "Friends, haven't you any fish?"

"No," they answered.

<sup>6</sup> He said, "Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." When they did, they were unable to haul the net in because of the large number of fish.

<sup>7</sup>Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, "It is the Lord," he wrapped his outer garment around him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water.8 The other disciples followed in the boat, towing the net full of fish, for they were not far from shore, about a hundred yards. 9 When they landed, they saw a fire of burning coals there with fish on it, and some bread.

<sup>10</sup> Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you have just caught." <sup>11</sup> So Simon Peter climbed back into the boat and dragged the net ashore. It was full of large fish, 153, but even with so many the net was not torn. 12 Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." None of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. 13 Jesus came, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. 14 This was now the third time Jesus appeared to his disciples after he was raised from the dead.

<sup>15</sup> When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?"

"Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you."

Jesus said, "Feed my lambs."

<sup>16</sup> Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you love me?"

He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you."

Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep."

<sup>17</sup>The third time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?"

Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you."

Jesus said, "Feed my sheep. 18 Very truly I tell you, when you were younger you dressed yourself and went where you wanted; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go."19 Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death by which Peter would glorify God. Then he said to him, "Follow me!"

REFLECTIONS: LIFE has a way of wearing us down. We stumble and fall. We fail. Our self-condemnation almost buries us and we retreat into our nature and our natural patterns ... often to the point that we never venture into the new waters and new directions that God may have for us.

I believe that was true for Peter and the other disciples.

As Jesus helps them to see their true heart, the destructive effect of self-condemnation gives way to a NEW LIFE AND NEW CALLING THAT JESUS ALWAYS INTENDED FOR US.

Realizing our true heart for God lifts us above the defeats and failures which we all experience this side of heaven.

Jesus helps to remind us and free us from the things of this world that often overwhelm us and defeat us.

AS WE STAND ON THE SHORES OF OUR GALILEE, DO YOU SEE JESUS CALLING OUT TO YOU --Encouraging you to cast your net in a different direction?

Encouraging you to come and enjoy the meal that Jesus has prepared for you?

Encouraging you and reminding you that He loves you and comes to you in your place of need?

Is Jesus asking you, "DO YOU LOVE ME" --- not that he does not know, but that He wants us to realize that in spite of our failures, we really do love Jesus?

And in that, do you see how important it is to Jesus that the church, the flock --- BE NURTURED, FED, AND CARED FOR?

How might we better nurture, feed, and care for one another at SHUMC?
