Ms. Pouncey's kindergarten class had a great start to the school year. They have done many activities such as making pumpkin pudding and butter. Also, they planted grass seed and watched it grow. The kindergarteners really enjoyed all their specials, especially art. They made turkeys and polar bears along with other crafts.

Kindergarten (Ms. Pouncy)

First grade has recently been preparing for Thanksgiving. The students put together paper bag turkeys and stuffed them with newspapers. They also decorated paper crowns printed with turkeys on them and the words "Happy Thanksgiving." In class, they have been practicing sight words, working on words that begin and end with "blends," and doing more independent reading. They have also been practicing the word "perseverance" which they know means to try again and again and not succumb to defeat. For math they have been practicing doubles facts and writing addition sentences. This is just the beginning for 1st grade! They are ready to *persevere* through the rest of the year and experience new activities.

1st grade

In Ms. Quade's 3rd grade class this year, they have done activities and projects. In science they learned about the continents and habitats. During recess the students enjoy playing 4 square and Frisbee. They also designed their own monsters and presented them to the class.

3rd Grade

During the first quarter, we were coming in from recess and saw a black snake slither across the sidewalk. In science class, we had 2 specific projects that we had a lot of fun doing. The first is a mold experiment where we let bread sit out for 15 days and the second was an animal adaptation diorama. Overall, we have had a fun start to our 4th grade year.

4th Grade

Kindergarten has recently been doing fun projects with Ms. Shaw. In art class they made turkeys and polar bear models. They also did science experiments. They love having centers at school and going to see each one. The top thing on their list is recess.

Kindergarten (Ms. Shaw)

In 2nd grade we are learning about adding 2- digit numbers and converting dimes to pennies. We are also learning about different animal groups (reptiles, mammals, etc.) We are learning about First Communion as well.

2nd Grade

During the first quarter of 5th grade, we mostly did science. In science we made a plan on how to save the environment and got to use the computer lab. We are doing class dojo. Class dojo is a point earning system. We can earn things like the prize box for 25 points and a stuffed animal for 30 points. That's most of what we did.

5th Grade

This is what we were doing in the first quarter of 6th grade. In Math we learned about angles, how to multiply and divide fractions, and one other thing we learned about were reciprocals. For ELA we learned a lot of things. We learned about vocabulary, appositives, and nouns as subjects. In Literature, we read stories that fit the topic of growing and changing. 7th Grade

We also planted a garden early in the year and recently returned to pick apples and potatoes that had sprouted. Like other classes we attended the assembly in honor of local fire/rescue workers and law enforcement. During the assembly the student council president, Lyla Bailey, presented them with the items collected by all the students. The 8th grade also participated in school fundraisers and events such ass Hobbit Day, the fall Bazaar, the bake sale for the OLSS basketball teams, and S'mores and stories.
