Council of Women: The Council of Women acts through its affiliated organizations to support, empower, and educate all women in spirituality, leadership, and service. The council's projects include and are not limited to: The Fall Luncheon, Saint Martha's Baby Project, Christmas Stocking Stuffer, and general membership meeting featuring keynote addresses by prominent community leaders. All women in the parish are welcome and encouraged to become actively involved in this outstanding and vital organization.

Knights of Columbus: A fraternity of Catholic gentlemen dedicated to the principles of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. The Knights work to fulfill the central mission of the order providing charitable work, serving the parish, supporting the temporal and spiritual needs of brother Knights, acting for the good of country and giving aid to the sick and poor.

Ladies of Charity: The Ladies of Charity respond to the needs of the poor by distributing food to low income, homeless, or unemployed women; providing contact to social workers; assisting with medical expenses; providing vouchers for food, clothing, and rent; and pursuing many other courses of service. Through their variety of actions, from assisting those in prison to responding to natural disasters like Hurricane Katrina, the Ladies of Charity show the truthfulness of their name.

Coffee and Donuts Fellowship: This is a ministry of hospitality, fellowship, and community. After each Sunday Mass this ministry serves coffee and donuts as the catalyst to bring the parishioners together in an informal and hospitable place. Volunteers may set up tables and chairs or may provide the pastries and coffee.

Refugee Ministry: The Saint Olaf Refugee Ministry provides ongoing assistance to newly arrived refugees, working directly with Catholic Community Services (CCS). Refugees arrive from countries including Afghanistan, Burma, Chad, the Congo, Indonesia, Iraq, Liberia, Nigeria, Senegal, Serbia, Somalia, Sudan, and Vietnam. These families have fled violence and persecution and are in great need of a welcoming community. CCS provides an in-depth training session to our new mentor families.

Sunday School of Religion: Offers religious instruction for students in kindergarten through 8th grade. Volunteer catechists and aides, using age-appropriate religious texts, teach the basics of our Catholic faith. This is a challenging and rewarding experience for

those who volunteer to pass on their faith. This program prepares our parish children for First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation. The program also prepares older children for Baptism.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA): RCIA is a process of inquiry to introduce adults to the Catholic faith and our community. It's an informal environment in which the inquirer is encouraged to ask questions and participate in discussion about the Catholic faith. The focus is on prayer and practical application of God's Word in daily life. Volunteer facilitators introduce the inquirers to the faith through topical discussion. Volunteer sponsors guide the inquirers along their journey by praying with them and sharing life experiences.

Youth Ministry: Volunteers to the youth ministry endeavor to help youth become faithful servants of the Lord and good citizens of the world. This ministry focuses on meeting the core needs of the community through prayer and worship, evangelization, catechesis, pastoral care, community life, peace and justice, and leadership development. Volunteer opportunities include: chaperoning an event, facilitating a meeting, serving as a keynote speaker, helping to plan a liturgy or prayer service, and serving on a fund raising committee.

Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts: Scouting has weaved a lifetime of values into fun and educational activities designed to help parents teach their sons how to make good decisions. Scouting teaches each boy to do his best to be helpful to others. Volunteers may become scout leaders or may volunteer to help with individual events.

Jail Ministry: Our mission is to reach out to God's incarcerated children. Help them establish a spiritual foundation in hope that they recognize they are good people making poor choices. We provide them with Seven Communion Services per week: four on Tuesdays, two on Saturdays and one on Thursday at the Jail's Work-Center. On Thursday a special service is provided at the Youth Detention Center.
