INTIMACY THROUGH PRAYER

(Acts 1:12-14; Psalm 27: 1, 4, 7-8; 1Peter 4: 13-16; John 17:1-11a)

Jesus raised His eyes to heaven and said (prayed), "Father, the hour has come. Give glory to Your Son, so that Your Son may glorify You..."

One may sometimes wonder why Jesus needed to pray. He is God the Son, and He is as close to the Father as He possibly could be. Why then did He need to pray? Louis Evely in his book, Teach Us To Pray, once wrote, "Too many Christians regard God as pilots regard their parachute, namely, good if needed, but better if they can get along without it." In today's society, those of us who are technologically savvy, like to spend as many hours as possible on the phone or Internet with those that we love. The younger generations could spend endless hours *texting* and/or chatting with their friends. Communication is always the key to a lasting friendship! We talk to our friends not only when we need a favor from them, but most importantly, because we love them and are in a relationship with them. Jesus prays to the Father, because He is in a relationship with the Father. Prayer strengthens our relationship and bolsters our intimacy with Jesus.

In today's first reading, we see the Disciples returning to the upper room where Jesus had the Last Supper. The picture of the Disciples gathering with some women together with Mary, the mother of Jesus, is symbolic and idyllic as they devote themselves "with one accord to prayer." This account by St. Luke demonstrates to us the importance of our unity when we gather together at the Lord's Table to celebrate the Eucharist. Like the Lord's mother and the Disciples, when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, which is a symbol of our Christian unity, we are "in one accord" with God and with one another. It is the greatest of all pravers, a symbol of our Christian unity, which enriches our relationship with God, the Father, through Christ in the unity of His Holy Spirit.

Today's gospel presents us with the first part of Jesus' final words to His Disciples, often called Jesus' High Priestly Prayer, because here, in the language incomprehensible apart from His Jewish heritage, He prays that the Father glorify His Son, that He become a Father to His Disciples and make them holy, and prays for those who through the word of the Disciples may come to know His Father. Jesus' last testament is that His followers be brought into the kind of loving union that He shares with the Father. The prayer touches on some important issues. First and foremost, He sees His suffering and death as a glorification: "Father, the hour has come. Give glory to Your Son." The intent and purpose of this glorification is "that Your Son may give eternal life to all You gave Him." And the meaning of this eternal life is "that (we) should know God as the only true God, and the one Whom He sent. Jesus Christ."

Jesus understands that while in the world, Christians, will be tempted and be persecuted, hence, "I pray for them...because they are Yours...and everything of Yours is Mine...And now I will no longer be in the world but they are in the world, while I am coming to You." Jesus has given Himself to us in the Eucharist, and next Sunday He will send us the Holy Spirit Who will help us to pray for God's strengthen and guidance in the midst of the world's calamities and afflictions, and also in times of temptation and persecution.

Their professional social workers provide sensitive, compassionate and confidential counseling to any client regardless of age, legal status, religion, race or economic status. All services are free. Maternity services social workers are available to schedule visits with the client at a convenient location, either an office setting, the client's home or at a site requested by the client.

Home studies and placement services for prospective adoptive parents planning to adopt domestically or internationally are also provided. They also have an International Adoptive Placement program with the Democratic Republic of the Congo. They are working on a Bulgarian program.


