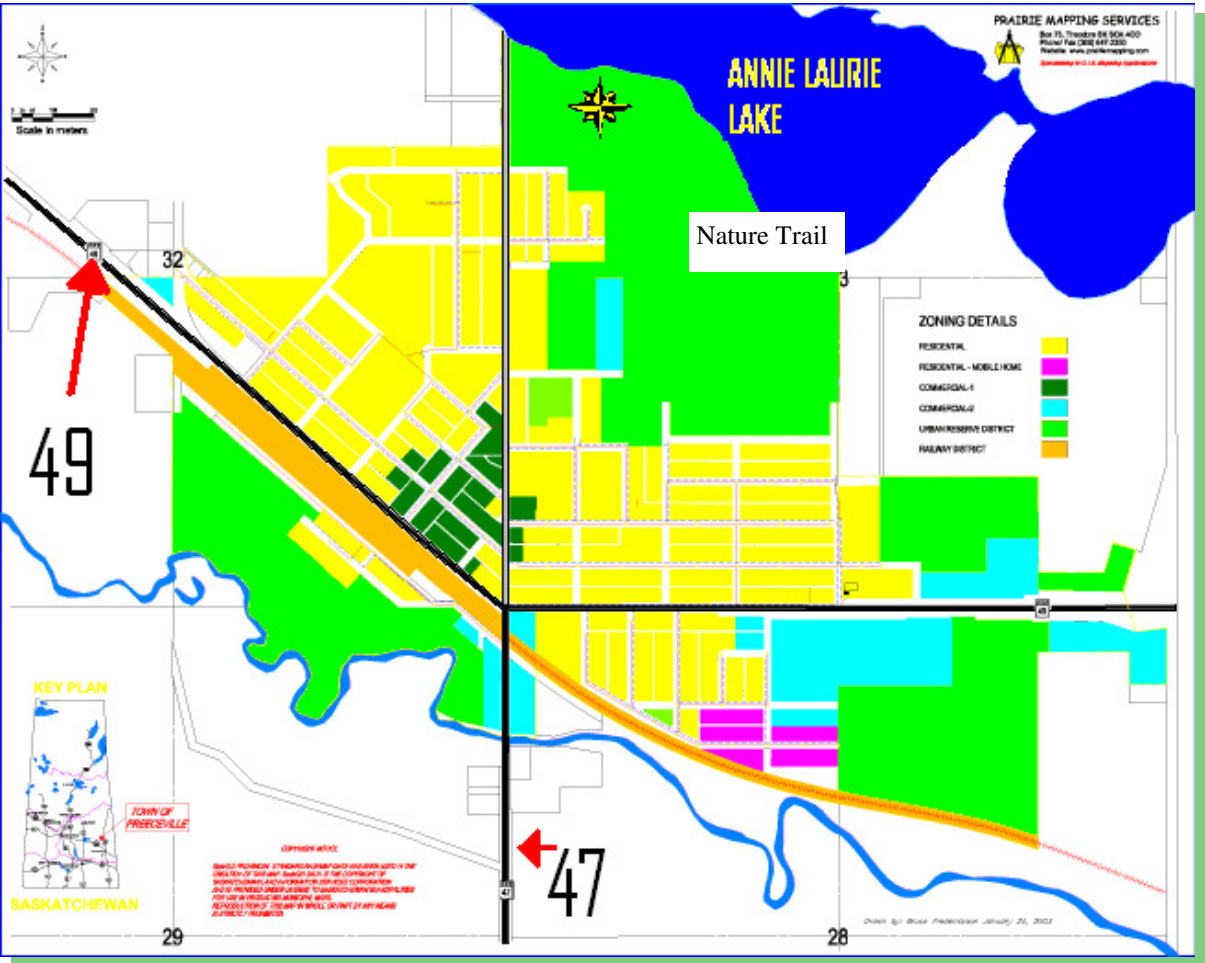
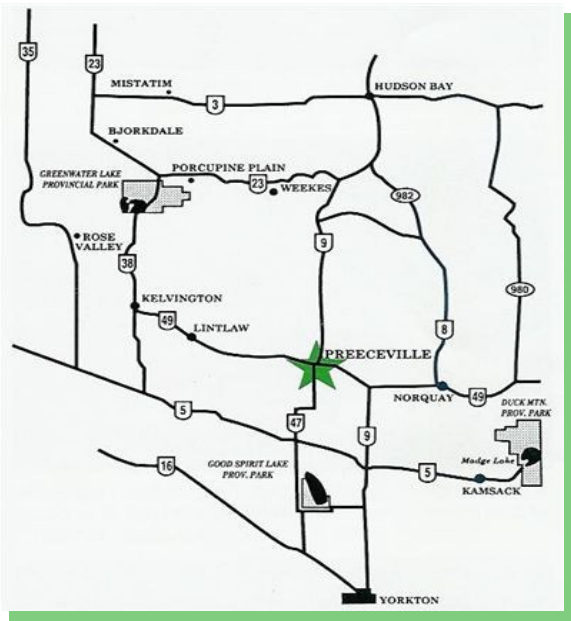



Preeceville's Nature/Bird Trails

Come to Preeceville's nature trail and enjoy an afternoon of bird watching at Annie Laurie Lake. There you will be able to view a variety of unique birds, plants and all sorts of wildlife. The trail is great for viewing nature but also provides a nice walking trail. Our trail is located at the north end of the town and just east of Annie Laurie Lake beach. Annie Laurie Lake has washroom facilities as well as a fire pit. At Annie Laurie Lake you can go swimming, canoeing, or boating. Furthermore, just south of the beach and the nature trail is the Wildlife Federation Campgrounds. Here there is electrical sites where you can spend the night, cook food over open fire, and have a good time.

On the Trail

There are many unique features that this trail has to offer. A unique feature about the area of Preeceville is that it is located between the borders of the Parkland forest and the Boreal forest. This makes for a wide variety of trees, flowers, fungi, mosses and grasses. While on the trail you may want to keep an eye open for a beaver lodge and many interpretive signs about plants, wildlife and birds. The Osprey in the summer and the Black Backed Woodpecker in the winter are two of the rare birds found in the Preeceville area. You can also expect to see birds such as loons, ruddy ducks, killdeer along with over 260 species of birds.

Preeceville is located in the east-central region of Saskatchewan, approximately 105 km north of Yorkton and at the junction of highways 9,49 and 47. Preeceville is known for its beautiful scenery as it is the headwaters of the Assiniboine River. It is in the northern part of the parkland region and at the southern edge of the timber zone.
