HOA ANNUAL MEETING

On Thursday, May 16, 2019, the Barrington Place Homeowners' Association (BPHOA) will hold its Annual Meeting at the clubhouse at 13318 Rosstown, 7:30 p.m. On that date the membership will elect three (3) Board of Director positions currently set to expire on May 16, 2019. The three board position terms are for two (2) years. Lynn Johnson, Melanie Cockrell and Phil Rippenhagen will be running for re-election for positions 1, 2, and 3 respectively.

The candidate may submit a candidate profile for publication in the March and April *Banner*. Candidates are requested to keep profiles to 400 words or less due to space allocation in the *Banner*. Should a candidate wish to submit a longer candidate profile, a notation will be made in the Banner that a more extensive profile is posted on the Barrington Place website. Candidate Profiles will be published in the Banner one time during the period covered by the April issue. All profiles shall be kept on the Barrington Place website from the date first published on the website until after the election. Changes to a candidate profile on the BP website may be made by a candidate as long as changes are timely made. All candidates are requested to avoid vulgarisms and profanity in their profiles. Due to printing deadlines and the uncertainty of United States Postal delivery, it is questionable whether or not the May issue of the Banner would reach the membership before May 16, 2019; therefore, no proxy ballots or candidate profiles will be published in the May Banner issue.

TRASH REMINDER:

Please do not put trash out before 6:00 PM on the night before the scheduled pickup day. Trash cans must be stored out of public view. Also, do not place large boxes (tv's, game systems, stereos, etc.) out for trash, except on heavy trash day, the first Monday of each month. Criminals look for these items.

Heavy trash day is the 1^{st} Monday of the month.

ASSESSMENTS ARE PAST DUE

The 2019 annual assessments were past due on February 1, 2019. All past due accounts will be assessed interest in the amount of 10% per annum. A letter will be mailed after February 15th to all homeowners with past due balances. A certified demand letter, with a minimum \$35 collection fee being assessed to the

account, will be sent after March 15th. All past due accounts will be turned over to the Association's attorney for collection after April 15th. The collection process will be pursued to the full extent of the law, including foreclosure if necessary.

CURB NUMBER ADDRESSES ARE COMING THIS YEAR !!!!!!

British British Barrington PhoA wants to paint address numbers on the curb for all 1021 homes in the Barrington Place HOA. There is no charge to the homeowner.

It has been close to 20 years since the entire community had uniform fresh curb address numbers in front of their houses. Since then many of the curb addresses have faded and some are missing entirely due to curb repairs and City construction. Some houses cannot be located since they do not have either a house number or a curb number address. By having a visible curb address, fire, police, and emergency vehicles save precious seconds in finding the correct address and that may save a life and/or stop a fire from spreading. Delivery trucks can quickly find the addresses and accomplish their deliveries and leave the streets free and clear of parked vehicles.

Many homeowners on their own initiative have maintained/painted visible curb address numbers that do not currently need painting. Some owners have gone above and beyond a plain curb number by painting specially designed individualized curb address numbers (Astros, Texans, etc.). These existing in place curb numbers are acceptable if in good condition. Those owners may not want to have a 2^{nd} address number on their curb and may want to opt out.

BURGLARY OF MOTOR VEHICLES

How can residents partner with the police to prevent Burglary of Motor Vehicles.

In 2018 the Sugar Land Police Department completed too many Burglary of Motor Vehicle (BMV) reports. We need your help in reducing the numbers.

The overall goal of the department is to develop partnerships and joint problem-solving techniques with the community that will increase the safety and quality of life for residents and visitors of The City of Sugar Land. How can the community partner with the department to assist in the reduction of BMVs?

One of the easiest ways for the community to partner with the department is to take simple steps to secure their property. Several of the BMV reports taken each year are a result of valuables being left in vehicles and vehicles being left unlocked.

- Take all personal belongings out of your vehicles for the night.
- Lock all doors and roll up all windows.
- Turn on outside lights at home at night.

HOME LIGHTING, it works!

Exterior home lighting does aid in reducing the likelihood of your vehicle falling victim to intrusion. Criminals don't like to be seen especially at night.

Does your home have proper and adequate lighting? There are different types of lighting used on the exterior of a home; landscaping lighting, architectural accent lighting, and security lighting.

Which kind of lighting does your house have?

House of Darkness?

A house in total darkness is a good target for a criminal as it provides complete cover.

House with a nearby street light?

A house has minimal illumination from a nearby street light. Relying on street lights alone is not the best solution as it still allows for several unlit areas around the home and shadows for criminals to blend in with.

Landscaping lighting?


Landscaping lights add a nice effect to the exterior of the home, but provide little lighting to assist in the security of the property. This is a result of the upward lights casting shadows between the lights and only illuminating the area in close proximity to the light placement.

Down Lighting

Down-lighting is one of the most effective forms of lighting for a home. This style of lighting cast the light down and out in a broader spectrum. Reducing the shadows at ground level and when complemented with column or porch lighting works nicely to illuminate the yard.

Place additional lighting as well over the driveway area to illuminate the vehicles.

FORT BEND COUNTY HEALTH

Fort Bend County Health & Human Services recommends residents to vaccinate against measles.

Measles activity has spiked in our neighboring counties. As of today, no confirmed cases of measles have been reported to the health department, Fort Bend County Health & Human Services. Individuals should protect themselves through vaccination. Vaccination is the best way to provide protection against measles and other diseases.

"Measles is an easily preventable disease. Individuals can protect themselves and their family against the disease by getting vaccinated," said Dr. Mary desVignes-Kendrick, Director of Fort Bend County Health & Human Services. "Measles is a highly contagious disease, and it can spread quickly in communities where people are not vaccinated. Protect yourself, your family, and the community by vaccinating against diseases." Measles can be serious, especially for young children and anyone who is not protected against measles. It is so contagious that if one person has it, 90% of the people around him or her will also become infected if they are not protected. Measles spreads through the air when an infected person coughs or sneezes. It starts with a fever, and then it causes a cough, runny nose, and red eyes. Then a rash of tiny, red spots breaks out. It starts at the head and spreads to the rest of the body. Measles can lead to pneumonia, encephalitis (swelling of the brain), and death.

You can protect your child against measles with a combination vaccine that provides protection against three diseases: measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR). The MMR vaccine is proven to be very safe and effective. CDC recommends that children get two doses:

• the first dose at 12 through 15 months of age, and

• the second dose before entering school at 4 through 6 years of age.

Your child's doctor may offer the MMRV vaccine, which protects against measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella (chickenpox). MMRV vaccine is licensed for children 12 months through 12 years of age. It may be used in place of MMR vaccine if a child needs to have varicella vaccine in addition to measles, mumps, and rubella vaccines. Your child's doctor can help you decide which vaccine to use.

Fort Bend County Health & Human Services will continue to monitor the nation, state, and region-wide spike of measles.
