A Word from Rev. Jackson

Greetings and Happy New Year in the Name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Welcome to 2018, the year of our Lord! Standing at the threshold of a new year gives us an opportunity to contemplate what we would like to accomplish in the year that lies ahead of us. Is there anything we would like to develop in our spiritual life? Are there ways we could develop a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ in 2018? In other words, what are our spiritual resolutions?

May I suggest that we write some of these things down so we can reflect upon them in December of 2018. The Apostle Paul gave a spiritual resolution to the early Christians in the book of Hebrews:

Hebrews 10: 23-25 - "23 Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, 25 not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another - and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

This letter was written to Christians who were suffering severe persecution. Paul's resolutions were given to help these Christians from falling away from the mission of Jesus Christ.

Verse 23 to paraphrase: "Hold fast" to our Lord Jesus who gives us hope without wavering because we can trust in the "faithfulness" of Jesus's promise. These were powerful and assuring words to Christians who have and would face terrible persecutions in the future. They are words of assurance to us as well as we look into the future... for we go into this New Year with the Lord Jesus at our side... and He will not fail.

Verse 24 - "provoke one another to love and good deeds." The other meanings for the word provoke would be "to spur, stimulate, stir up, excite, arouse, or call into action." All for the purpose of love and good

deeds. Imagine if this were one of our goals as a Christian church. Purposely *encourage* one another to put our love and good deeds into action. This is what made the early church stand out, because no one else was doing this! There were evil temptations dragging one another down, but no positive uplifting to care and nourish a love for each other in Christ. Acting on this verse still works today!

Verse 25 "not neglecting to meet together as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching." The verse is indicating that the more we meet together, the more we can encourage one another to love and do good deeds, so that we are doing this when Christ returns. The verse was an admonition to help keep the persecuted Christians from backsliding.

There is a saying that 85% of life is *showing up*. The more frequently we are present to one another, the more we can help each other in our struggles. This is what "church" is supposed to be all about. The daily grind of life can be very discouraging and pull us down. Being *present* to one another in Jesus Christ in His church gives us an opportunity to put God's gifts of love and good deeds into action. Then, and only then, spiritual growth can really happen. Combine this with daily prayer and Bible study, and the year ahead looks brighter already!

I pray that 2018 will be a year that enables each of us to have hope and excitement for the future that will carry us through the next twelve months and beyond.

Remember, because He Lives, so do we!
