



Don Brock's AAR 'Cuda from Yesteryear



It was 1973 and my AAR 'Cuda was in the shop at the Page Dittman Chrysler Plymouth Dealer in Baytown, Texas with the heads off. I had somehow melted a hole in the top of one of the pistons (Street Race? Me?) Fortunately, it was covered under warranty, the Famous Chrysler 5year / 50,000 mile. (Service Manager complained, "Damn Factory Race Car should'a never had a 5 year warranty!")

So, anyway, I had been driving my spare, a '68 green 4 door Dodge Dart that Mom gave me when Dad bought her a new AMC Hornet (what a mistake, that car should have had a 'Factory Tow-bar' installed) My brother and I used and abused that Dart over the years.
