Cooking Safety

Cooking fires are the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries.

Stay in the kitchen and closely monitor your meal anytime you are cooking. Keep an eye on what you fry!

Keep anything that can catch fire—oven mitts, utensils, food packaging, towels or curtain—away from you stove

Install and learn how to use a fire extinguisher. Contact your local fire department for training.

If you have a small cooking fire: On a stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled. For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the oven door closed. If in doubt, just get out! If flames spread to objects beyond the stove or oven, evacuate immediately. When you leave close the door behind you to help contain the fire.







SCAM ALERT—Sweetheart Scam

The Ohio Attorney General warns of sweetheart scams, a specific and personal type of phishing. In a sweetheart scam an individual may try to start a relationship with you so that they can eventually ask for money or personal information. They will build a friendly or romantic relationship with their would-be victim through messages and phone calls over weeks, months, or longer.

Then, they will fake a serious situation, such as illness, an accident, unexpected medical costs, legal action, or more. Calling on your kindness, they'll ask you to help out by sending money, most often using a wire-transfer service, prepaid card, gift cards, or other hard-to-trace payment method. Once the money is sent, it is nearly impossible to recover.

In a typical example of a sweetheart scam, the scammer claims to be from the U.S. but temporarily located somewhere else. For example, the scammer may pretend to be a military member stationed in Afghanistan, an engineer building bridges in South Africa, an oil rig worker off the Gulf coast, a contractor working in Nigeria, a businessperson stuck in London, or something similar. Some scammers create phony profiles on dating websites and social media and gaming platforms to attract victims, establish relationships with them, and then trick them into sending money.

These scammers are committed to their con, not you. They are dedicated and willing to commit a lot of time and effort to their crime. They get to know you, which makes them very dangerous. They earn your trust specifically so they can betray it. If you believe you or someone you know may be the target of a sweetheart scammer, do not try to handle the situation yourself. Cut off all contact with the individual and contact local law enforcement. Be prepared to show evidence of online, phone, and in-person contacts to help officials investigate the crime.

Perfect Fruit Salad

Sauce:

Salad:



2/3 C. fresh orange juice

2 C. cubed fresh pineapple

1/3 C. fresh lemon juice

2 C. strawberries, hulled & sliced

1/3 C. packed brown sugar

3 kiwi fruit, peeled & sliced

1/2 tsp. grated orange zest1/2 tsp. grated lemon zest

2 oranges, peeled & sectioned

1 tsp. vanilla extract

1 C. seedless grapes

2 C. blueberries

3 bananas, sliced

Combine sauce ingredients to a boil in a saucepan over medium high heat. Reduce heat to medium low and simmer until slightly thickened, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat & stir in vanilla. Set aside to cool.

Put fruit in a large bowl. Pour cooled sauce over fruit: cover and refrigerate for 3-4 hours before serving.

You can customize this by using any fruit that you like.

Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA—If you have an IRA and are required to take a

mandatory distribution, did you know that you can make a transfer directly from your IRA to a charity of your choice and the contribution is not taxed? You can give up to \$100,000 from your IRA to a charity and it will be counted towards your RMD but isn't included in your adjusted gross income. If you want further information on how you can make a gift to the Senior Center from your IRA, please contact your financial advisor.


