

FROM THE PASTOR

October 13, 2019
 Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time
 Lk 17:11-19

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Ten Little Lepers! One cut out to thank Jesus, and then there were nine! Yet, all ten of them had gone to Jesus for healing! Surprisingly, Jesus simply tells them to visit the Temple and take an interview with the priests there. They faithfully follow Jesus' prescription (Why not, what else is on a leper's schedule for the day?) So they head toward the Temple, and suddenly, **they are healed along way!** Luke 17:15-16, says, "One of them, **realizing he had been healed**, returned *(to Jesus)*, glorifying God in a loud voice; falling at Jesus' feet and thanking him." This one leper realizes the source of his healing, and he goes back to Jesus. Yet I wonder: Did the other nine also realize they were healed, but just keep on going to the Temple as they were told? Or did they not even realize at all that they had been healed? Only the one grateful leper doubled back, who both knew he was healed and knew who had healed him! He acknowledges and thanks the Source of Healing, Jesus!

People usually have a lot to say about why we should or why we shouldn't 'go through the motions'. I think this leper healing story teaches the importance of being aware and insightful about the 'motions' or rituals we employ. Since we Catholics have such an 'organized' and 'structured' practice of faith, we are often criticized for only 'going through the motions'. But, that criticism overlooks the great value of rote learning and practice, practice, practice. *(It is also lame, to simply reject out of hand or like a kneejerk any 'organized' ritual of 'going through the motions' without first asking 'why' and finding what is behind it!)* The great value of repetition and identifiable routines is that they often save the day when we are tested, opposed or tried. Ask any soldier about the importance of drills and exercises (every day is training day!). Or ask any successful worker about their business protocols or decision trees. Why does a good athlete run the same plays in practice, over and over again? Is it only 'going through the motions'? Yes, in the beginning, but that is how you acquire the skill! Then, after mastering the basics, the muscle memory allows the mind to 'get even more into it', or 'get even more out of it'. One (of so many) things I love about our Catholic Faith is the structure it provides, rooted in such a long-standing tradition. Wisdom, hard-earned over many generations, is implanted in the rituals or 'motions' we practice. We have so much to discover and further unleash by taking the second step of seeking their inner purpose and history. I think the healed and grateful leper demonstrates this powerful awakening of deeper faith. He diligently follows through on the 'motion' and practice of 'going to the Temple', as told by Jesus. Yet, exploring in prayer his encounter with Jesus, and pondering over Jesus' words, he suddenly 'realizes'. "Priest? Temple?, that is Jesus!" And so he goes to the Temple, by returning back to Jesus. The leper's active seeking of what is behind the 'motions' is what makes the spiritual difference. He knows the place of the 'motion'. He wants to be awake and aware. And he realizes he is healed. Maybe the other nine are asleep at the wheel and just doing one more thing because they are told. Jesus is revealing that the Temple is personal, and that He himself is the new temple (Matthew 12:6, Jesus will say, "There is something greater than the temple here" *Yes, Him!*) I suspect that Jesus sent the healed and grateful leper off again back to the Temple, as a witness and evangelist to at least the other nine healed lepers, but also to the priests there!

The door to deeper meaning in the leper story for me, is his **'realizing'** on the road to the Temple. He 'awakens' in the 'motions'. He is praying over and asking "What is going on? What am I doing? What is behind my doing it?" The healed and grateful leper can fully go through even a monotonous ritual experience but he knows the 'what', the 'why', and the 'who' of it. His heart's insight opens whole new dimensions to otherwise routine and simple gestures. It all begins through continued and careful performance of inherited 'practices', yet through the penetrating gain of insight, even more inner meaning and purpose is revealed. I find that Peter and his fishing friends go through a similar enlightening experience into 'motions' with Jesus in Luke 5:4-6. Peter and friends had been 'going through motions' all night and came up empty, until they begin 'listening closely' to Jesus. Simon Peter replied, "Master, we have worked through the night without catching anything. **But because You say so, I will let down the nets again**" (v.5) By seeking Jesus more deeply in the 'motions', they 'caught it'. We have to 'seek'. The organized ritual and practice is not to blame. My inattention and negligence are what hold me back from understanding and experiencing Christ's life more deeply. Or as Colbie Caillat sings, we have to 'take time to realize'!
