"Old Business" should be placed on the Agenda.

False

The term "Old Business" should be avoided since it may incorrectly suggest the revisiting of all old items ever discussed. The term Unfinished Business is the appropriate term to use when addressing questions that have come over from the previous meeting that were not resolved prior the adjournment. **Please see RONR 11th Edition, page 358, lines 1–8.**

All Questions require Debate and a Formal Vote.

False

Time can be saved by the procedure Unanimous Consent or as it was formerly called, General Consent. When there seems to be no opposition in routine business or on questions of little importance the chair (President) may asks, "Is there any objection to...?" Or may state, "There being no objection to..." The Chair (President) pauses and if no member objects, the matter is resolved with a motion and the vote is taken. **Please see RONR 11th Edition, pages 54–56 for more details regarding Unanimous Consent.**

The name of the member that seconds a motion should always be in the minutes.

The name of the maker of a motion should be placed in the Minutes, while the name of the member that seconds the motion is not requires unless ordered by the assembly. RONR 11th Edition, page 470, lines 26-28.

The Eleventh Episcopal District Handy Simmons Scholarship, established in 2010, offers financial assistance to high school seniors who will be attending a college or university and students who are currently pursuing undergraduate degrees.

Eligibility for the

Handy Simmons Scholarship

Who is eligible to apply for Handy-Simmons Scholarships?

- Active members of the A.M.E. Church and the YPD
- Current high school seniors who will be attending college in the fall.
- Students who are presently pursuing a Bachelor's or Associate's (AA, AS or AAS) degree.

What are the criteria for consideration?

- Academic performance
- Quality and level of church participation, including leadership roles
- Quality of essay writing
- Extracurricular activities and leadership roles as described in the application and letters of recommendation.

What is the amount of the scholarship?

Each conference will be awarded a \$1000.00 scholarship per conference year to an eligible student.




