JOBS IN THE GARDEN:

Well, the Summer weather gods have continued to smile upon us with very few hot days to date though, as I'm sure Chris Bourne will remind us when he next does a report it's been a while since we were blessed with a good soaking rain!

Continue to keep the mulch topped up to reduce moisture loss and keep precious plants cool. We continue to battle an army of blackbirds, sparrows and now pigeons who are all intent in carrying off as much as possible for their nests, or whatever they're using it for.

Unfortunately, in our garden probably half of our all stone fruits succumbed to fungal diseases, rotting on the tree before fully ripening though we still had wonderful big crops. Sadly, our green bin continued to have a big workout with so much waste. However, we still have had plenty to give away and make jams as usual. Our roses, cucumbers and pumpkins are currently under attack from fungal diseases and require some eco-fungicide before they succumb.

Remember to feed your hard-working fruit trees once they've completed their harvest with a good all round fertiliser then water in well. This stands the trees in good stead for next Summer's crop.

Now is the time to start considering what Winter annuals you'll be planting such as Pansies, Violas, Polyanthus, Alyssum or Cinerarias or look for other varieties available at your local garden centres.
