Then [Jesus] said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." (Matt 9:37-38)

This June I will celebrate the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my ordination. I was ordained at my home congregation of Martin Luther Lutheran Church in Coletoville on June 7, 2008. The members of my home congregation presented me with a handmade stole; its design mirroring the stained glass windows behind the altar. With pride they said every member put a stitch into the stole, even the guys! That stole would forever be a memento to remind me of where I came from as God called me out into the world to serve the church.

As he does with his disciples in every generation, the Lord has sent me into places and put me into community with people I would have never known. My wife, Gemayel, has walked with me through good years and bad years in the church. Truly, I would not be the pastor I am today without her by my side. God has truly blessed me, and I am so happy to serve as your pastor in Shiner!

Since 2008, I have done 37 baptisms welcoming children and adults into God's kingdom. If I count non-member funerals and graveside services, I have officiated around 150 funerals. In each of those funerals, I've proclaimed the Christian message that God is more powerful than death and our faith is anchored in God's love in Jesus to raise us from the dead. I've done dozens of weddings and confirmations. As Jesu sent out his disciples in Matthew 9, the Lord has truly sent me out and trusted me with much. For that I am grateful and humbled. With God's help, I still have many years left in the ministry.

Jesus always sends his disciples out in every age – out into the fields of the world – and that is important work. It is important because Jesus sends out not just pastors but all the baptized. It is a commissioning to each of us to bring the good news to a world that longs for the Kingdom of God. I believe the harvest can and will be plentiful. But it takes many hands, and this is where you come in!

This summer there will be many chances for you and your families to gather in and join us in worship. On Sundays when we worship together, God strengthens us through our mutual singing and the hearing of scripture. God feeds us in worship with his body and blood in Holy Communion. And then, as God always does, he sends us out into the world to share the good news.

The dismissal at the end of worship is so fitting. Our youth (with much enthusiasm!) exclaim, "Go in peace. Serve the Lord."

And every Sunday our common reply is, "Thanks be to God. And weee will!"

Six young people celebrated First Communion after completing a class with Pastor Chris. March brought a session of the Women's Bible Study & Lunch. In April, two years of confirmation instruction culminated in the confirmation of three young people. Throughout March and April the Wednesday evening GIFT program continued to grow and flourish. On Wednesday April 26, the end-of-year GIFT celebration included a huge inflatable obstacle course, face

Plans for a "Stellar" space-themed Vacation Bible School began, with Samantha Scott volunteering to direct VBS. 2023 Campers and their families worked together on a hamburger fundraiser at the SVFD Car Show and sold Nothing Bundt Cakes to finish raising funds for this summer.



Caring Ministries worked constantly behind the scenes supporting others with Grief Support, Homebound Visitation, and Home Touch mailings. During spring, a Prayer Shawl Ministry was restarted with the new name of Hearts & Hands, indicating the caring hearts and skilled hands that knit or crochet these shawls. The group began meeting monthly, and the blessing and distribution of shawls for those in need began once again. A special Baby

Shower for Vicar Daniel and Mallory Volkmann was held in anticipation of their first child. JOY, Just Older Youth, was held in May with a "comfort food" meal as a caring ministry for the elderly as well as a growing fellowship for this age group. Our hospitality team hosted special receptions and meals each Sunday in April. We thank this dedicated group—the Hospitality Team models caring and service for all of us.



Our fellowship groups are now part of Connecting Ministries, since the connection of fellowship supports and encourages sharing the Gospel in community. Following a Country Gospel Worship Service in March, the Church Council hosted a Church Fellowship Meal, connecting the congregation with grilled hamburgers and conversation. During April, our

youth joined the Lutheran Youth from Nordheim in an outing to the Shiner Escape Room. An overnight youth Lock In gathered young people to connect, to plan a Youth Service for the following day, and to bake communion bread for the service. Clergy and lay adults worked to supervise and support the youth.



For many years, our congregation has given scholarships to high school graduates and others pursuing advanced education. The scholarships are given as a cash grant so that recipients can freely choose to use the funds where they are most needed. Our scholarship application focuses on applicants demonstrating faith and service as Christians within their worshiping communities. Since their inception, the scholarships were funded by earnings from our Endowment Fund investments. Those earnings were not available this year, so an appeal was made for donations to fund scholarships. Once again, the generosity of our members and their support of youth came through and enabled us to award 2023 Shiner Lutheran Scholarships.

The weekly offerings from our 2022-2023 GIFT participants were used to purchase over \$1,300 in food supplies for the Shiner Community Food Pantry. Donations of food in the red wagon in the Gathering Place are taken there also. Members of the congregation help each week at the Food Pantry; once a month our members make and serve breakfast there.





Noisy Offerings are gathered on the last Sunday of the month. The Caring Mission Group determines the recipients of the offering. In February, we sent \$361.66 to Lutheran Disaster Response. The March Noisy Offering added \$311.67 to our Camper Fund. In April, we collected \$199.78 which will be sent to David & Alicia Brondos, the missionaries we help sponsor in Mexico City. Thank you!
