### Women <u>ARE</u> Veterans & may be eligible for many VA benefits

I love to travel, and visiting my sister military women is one of the most rewarding parts of being constantly on the go. However, it breaks my heart when any of my sisters say, "Oh, I'm not a veteran, because I didn't serve on a ship, or overseas, or during a war, or women aren't veterans..."



These things are simply not true, but many believe them, because that's what they were told by someone, at some time, in the past.

According to the US Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), the law defines a veteran as a person discharged from full-time, active military service

(Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps or Coast Guard) under other than dishonorable conditions. There are no caveats for where you served, when you served or what your physical sex is. Just because someone, at some time, said you were "not a veteran", doesn't make it a fact.

So, now that we've established the FACT that you ARE a veteran, what next? It is time for you to contact the VA and find out details about the benefits for which you may be eligible: Financial? Health-care? Education? Training? Economic? Employment? The list goes on and on.

And, if someone, at some time, said you were not eligible for a particular benefit, ask again. VA benefits, and eligibility requirements, have changed through the years. Also remember, each veteran's situation is different. Just because your friend was denied a particular benefit does not mean you'll be denied. Take time to apply, and see what happens.

Did you go to the VA previously, and felt like an outsider or that you didn't belong? Many of our sisters felt that way, and enough of them complained that the VA has made great strides toward correcting that situation.

In 1994, the VA established the Center for Women Veterans (<a href="https://www.va.gov/womenvet/">https://www.va.gov/womenvet/</a>), with the mission of monitoring and coordinating the VA's administration of health care, benefits, services, and programs for women veterans. They also serve as an advocate for cultural transformation, and to raise awareness of the responsibility to treat women veterans with dignity and respect.

While the system isn't perfect, the VA has made great strides toward providing the support and services women veterans have earned in an environment free from harassment.

Once you get to the VA, you may be amazed at the volume of benefits, services and programs which are available. Below is a list of many offerings. If you are viewing the bulletin online, you may click on any item below for more details:

If you're still not sure, call the Women Veterans Call Center at 1-855-VA-Women (1-855-829-6636) to get more info before you ever set foot in a VA office. The call is free, and regardless of what you were told by someone, at some time, in the past, you ARE a veteran and the benefit to you could be life-changing.

With many volunteer opportunities opening back up, our MWAN members have hit the ground running.

Even with Covid19 continuing to rear its ugly head, between June 2021 and May 2022 members reported a total of 16,430 volunteer hours: 288 in VA Service; 9,320 in direct veteran community service, and 6,822 in community Service. While actively seeking ways to serve our active and veteran military, MWAN members are making a huge difference in their own communities.

NAS Jacksonville as an Machinist Aviation Mate. overhauling and repairing the instrument panels on World War II fighter planes. It was there that she met her future husband, AM2 Walter Dunbar, who was also the base bugler. They were married in December 1945, shortly after the war ended. They eventually settled in Jacksonville where they raised their three daughters. Walter passed away in 1986.



On July 18, 2022, Jessie celebrated her 100th birthday with a large, patriotic party in Atlantic Beach. More than 85 friends and relatives packed the home for the occasion.

She was surprised with a parade including motorcycles from the local American Legion Riders as well as local fire and police departments. The television station that her husband had worked for as a sportscaster, now WTLV, Channel 12, was there to interview her, and the mayor issued a proclamation in her honor.

Several letters arrived from dignitaries such as the Naval Commander of NAS Jacksonville, the Jacksonville mayor, a State Senator and the Governor of Florida.

"The party was beautiful, with all of the people that I know and love attending. The parade was a complete surprise!" exclaimed Jessie.

Jessie continues to be active each day. She attributes her longevity to the goodness of God and a life of hard work. She travels to Cape Cod, MA, each summer, and enjoys telling her story of service and patriotism to school classes and others who want to learn. A visit to the World War II Museum in New Orleans is on her bucket list, and she hopes to cross that off this fall.

Jessie's life story is a testament of pulling yourself up by your bootstraps and rising above your difficult circumstances. She loves her flag, and this country, fiercely, and prays it will remain a country of freedom in the years ahead.

#### Possible option for veterans enrolled in VA healthcare

Being transported via ambulance to a local hospital emergency department is not a happy occasion for anyone. As a veteran who is enrolled in VA healthcare, I had wondered why we could not be transported to a VA hospital. Well, in March I had the opportunity to learn that that <u>IS</u> an option.

Hours after donating blood (I'm a regular), I was having lunch with a friend when I passed out. Twice. Someone in the café called 911 and the local paramedics swiftly arrived.

After their initial assessment, one asked if I'd like to be transported to a hospital. I told him that I declined Medicare and use only VA healthcare, and he told me I could be taken to the local VAMC (Carl T Hayden, in Phoenix, AZ) if it was approved by their ED.

I was stunned, pleased, but also skeptical. Can that be accurate? The paramedic told me he was also a veteran and aware of this new shift in policy. That was GREAT news but I declined in favor of my friend driving me home where I quickly recovered: Never knowing why I fainted...

I contacted the Assistant Director of the local VAMC to inquire about this, and he confirmed, going on to say he wished all veterans were aware of this. I said I would help spread the word, thus, this article.

Now, this is <u>NOT</u> a guarantee that every veteran can be transported to the VAMC for emergency care. You will need to tell the paramedic of your wish, and, if possible, provide the phone number to call for advance approval. Consider writing down the number, and keep it in your wallet next to your VA healthcare enrollment ID.

**IMPORTANT!** Emergency care at a VAMC is <u>NOT</u> guaranteed, and may not be an option, so you may be transported to a local hospital instead. If you are enrolled in VA healthcare, and have received care within the past 24 months, the VHA will likely cover the cost, but you <u>MUST</u> notify them within 72 hours. You can do this by calling (844) 724-7842 or your local VAMC.

VA healthcare is a GREAT benefit and can be used along with Medicare or private insurance. It's nice to have options! Take care of yourself and stay out of ANY hospital if possible.
