

Greetings Faithful Readers,

As many of you know, changes are going on at the park. Strasburg has started on the park projects that have been made available through the Open Spaces Land Acquisition and Development (OSLAD) Grant. The grant allows \$636,000 to be spent 50/50 through the state and village. Because of higher costs from when the grant was originally applied for, the grant we received will not cover all of the project. At this time the

Norma Rose was born on February 12, 1927, in Strasburg, IL, the daughter of Otto and Rosetta B. (Krile) Rincker. She married Ralph C. Crutcher on December 28, 1947, and he preceded her in death on January 15, 1982. She later married Wayne M. Huddleston on October 10, 1987, and he preceded her in death on April 8, 2004. Norma Rose was a life member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Strasburg, where she sang in the choir and was a member of Ladies Aid for 76 years. She also enjoyed meeting with the Seasoned Citizens group in Strasburg.

She spent most of her life working on crochet projects. Everyone in her family loved her homemade noodles and divinity. She liked to collect items, especially bells because the Rincker ancestors made bells in Germany and in the United States.


