FIRE OF LOVE AND UNITY

(Gen. 11:1-9; Rom. 8:22-27; Jn. 7:37-39; Acts 2:1-11; Gal. 5: 16-25; Jn. 20:19-23) The beginning of the Book of Genesis tells us that before Creation the earth was a formless void, thus, "when God began to create the heavens and the earth...the Spirit of God hovered over the waters" (Genesis 1:1-2). It was through the Spirit of God that the heavens and earth, and all that is in them were made. In other words, God's Spirit has a creative force. God's Spirit is what makes you and me exist today, because, after "Yahweh God formed Man, dust drawn from the clay, and breathed into his nostrils a breath of life and man became alive with breath" (Genesis 2:7).

Since Creation, the Spirit of God has had a living effect in God's creatures. God created Man in His own image, but Man would have remained a formless image without life if God did not breathe His Spirit into him. God's Spirit, therefore, is a source of life – a life-giving substance. The Spirit of God has always been a binding force of nature that bonded the human race together. But when Man sinned due to pride, and his longing to "be like God," He brought discord and division into the world (Gen. 3:1-13; 11:1-9).

Since the Fall of Adam and Eve, it has been our desire to be restored to our original state, thus, the Church prays, "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful and enkindle in them the fire of Thy love...Send forth Thy Spirit and they shall be created...And Thou shalt renew the face of the earth..." As the Church celebrates the feast of Pentecost today, she prays for the restoration of the human race to its former glory. The Church prays that the "Fire of Pentecost" should consume human pride, disunity, hatred, corruption, malice, selfishness, bigotry, and every form of evil that envelopes our world. She prays that the "Fire of Pentecost" should enkindle the "flame of love and peace" in our hearts – our families – our church – our community - our neighborhood – our country.

On Ascension Thursday, Jesus commissioned you and me, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." And last Sunday He prayed, "Holy Father, keep them in Your name that You have given Me, so that they may be one just as We are one." God's Spirit is a spirit of unity, and it is only this Spirit Who can bind us together. Thus, as we celebrate Pentecost, we should remember the binding force of a family fireplace - where warmth is felt, meal is shared, stories are told, memories are rekindled, and love is exchanged. Pentecost is a day for Christians all over the world to celebrate their unity, and their love for one another. As confirmed Christians, Pentecost reminds you and me of our responsibility to "go out to the whole world" and preach tolerance and peace instead of war and violence - unity instead of division.

In the United States, this Monday we celebrate Memorial Day. The unique thing about this day is that we celebrate the lives of those who were patriotic enough to die for their country. They obeyed the commands of their commander-in-chief, the President; thus, they died in the line of duty. As Christians, if indeed, sacrificial love touches our hearts, like the soldiers, we must be willing to die for our faith. We must obey our "Commander-in-Chief," Jesus Christ, by keeping His Commandments. The lessons of Memorial Day for you and me should go beyond the "fallen soldiers," and focus on whether, like them, we Christians are willing to carry out the wishes of our "Commander-in-Chief," Jesus Christ - making sacrifices that are required of any true and faithful Catholic. May the Pentecost Fire burn within our hearts!

1ST ANNUAL PARISH RAFFLE





PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

Come, Holy Spirit, fill my heart with Your holy gifts. Let my weakness be penetrated with Your strength this very day that I may fulfill all the duties of my state conscientiously, that I may do what is right and just. Let my charity be such as to offend



no one, and hurt no one's feelings; so generous as to pardon sincerely any wrong done to me.

Assist me, O Holy Spirit, in all my trials of life, enlighten me in my ignorance, advise me in my doubts, strengthen me in my weakness, help me in all my needs, protect me in temptations and console me in all afflictions. Graciously hear me, O Holy Spirit, and pour Your light into my heart, my soul, and my mind. Assist me to live a holy life and to grow in goodness and grace. Amen.



SYMBOLS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Water: The symbolism of water signifies the Holy Spirit's action in Baptism, since after the invocation of the Holy Spirit it becomes the efficacious sacramental sign of new birth.

Anointing: The symbolism of anointing with oil also signifies the Holy Spirit, to the point of becoming a synonym for the Holy Spirit.

Fire: While water signifies birth and the fruitfulness of life given in the Holy Spirit, fire symbolizes the transforming energy of the Holy Spirit's actions.

Cloud and Light: These two images occur together in the manifestations of the Holy Spirit in both Old and New Testaments.

The Seal is a symbol close to that of anointing. "The Father has set His seal" on Christ and also seals us in Him.

The Hand: Jesus heals the sick and blesses little children by laying hands on them. In His name the apostles will do the same.

The Finger: "It is by the finger of God that (Jesus) cast out demons.

The Dove: At the end of the flood, whose symbolism refers to Baptism, a dove released by Noah returns with a fresh olive-tree branch in its beak as a sign that the earth was again habitable.
