


#### **COMPONENTS OF POPULATION GROWTH**

Summary: From 2000 to 2017, births have remained relatively unchanged in Kitsap County, while deaths have been increasing steadily, resulting in a slowly decreasing natural change rate. In 2017, there were still more births than deaths, which means that natural change was positive, although very small (0.3%). In addition, the estimated migration rate of people into Kitsap County has remained at a steady low rate from 2000 to 2017, accounting for the majority of Kitsap's population growth.









Summary: The median age in Kitsap is 39 years, which is a statistically significant increase since 2000. Kitsap County has the 23rd highest median age of all the counties in Washington. The median age is slight higher for females and for those living on Bainbridge Island and in North Kitsap. Bremerton and Central Kitsap have the lowest median ages.











#### POPULATION BY AGE GROUP OVER TIME




RACE AND ETHNICITY Percentage





Summary: Students enrolled in public school are more diverse than the general population, with 64% being non-Hispanic White. All minority races have higher proportions among students than among the general population, except for non-Hispanic American Indian and Alaska Native. Hispanic and students of 2 or more races, in particular, are much higher proportions of the student population than of the general population. Bremerton and Central Kitsap are the most diverse school districts, while Bainbridge Island is the least diverse.






#### **NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING POPULATION**




### VETERAN POPULATION Percentage

Summary: The proportion of the population who are veterans has been decreasing from 2005-09 to 2013-17, but remains higher than the state. Central and South Kitsap have the highest veteran populations. The veteran population is almost 90% male. The majority (78%) has at least some college education, and the veteran population is slightly less diverse than the county population overall. 
