## DESCRIPTIONS

**Presentation Description for review** Please note, this description is used by the Planning Committee in selecting sessions and topics for the conference.

The presentation will provide an overview of the NH Public Health Laboratories-Water Analysis Lab's (WAL) capability during a drinking water emergency. We will highlight the laboratory's capabilities including its status as the State's principal laboratory. Review the laboratory's membership in EPA's Water Laboratory Alliance (WLA) and the Environmental Response Laboratory Network (RLN). We will discuss the tools available to the lab during a drinking water emergency. We will highlight recent Analytical Preparedness-Full Scale Exercises (AP-FSE) in which the laboratory worked with drinking water utilities to analyze real samples during a mock drinking water emergency. Session attendees will learn what types of emergencies the laboratory can be of assistance, including natural disasters like flooding, chemical spills or intentional contamination acts. The laboratory will discuss its role during all emergency response phases from initial response, mitigation and recovery, including guidance on analytical testing, sampling and reporting. We will provide information on a few real examples in which the laboratory participated in an emergency response action.

We will provide information on the resources NH Department of Environmental Services offers to communities and water suppliers to assist them in preparing for an emergency involving their source of drinking water. We will highlight a recent full-scale exercise on the Salmon Falls River where responders from both Maine and New Hampshire coordinated the response to a hypothetical chemical spill. We will share some of the lessons learned from that exercise, and how they can be applied in New Hampshire.

Police body-worn cameras (BWCs) have gained popularity in recent years. However, many minimize the complexity of this transparency initiative and elevate the potential benefits. While BWCs can promote police accountability, they may also reduce citizen trust in police organizations. For BWCs to achieve win-win solutions, police organizations should determine the level of citizen support for specific BWC practices. We conducted two survey experiments to test support among citizens for BWC. In our first study, we find statistically significant levels of social desirability for police discretion in the activation of BWCs and for restriction of footage accessibility regarding suspects with mental illness. The second survey examines public perceptions about using facial recognition through body-worn cameras. Our results are that gender, age and political affiliation matters to explain support for facial recognition via BWC, as females and non-Trump voters harbor reticence that they only express when provided with a measure of anonymity. The methods we employed suggest that decision makers should not rely on public opinion polls as a gauge of true citizen support for BWC use. The issue is more complex and in need of methodologies that account for social pressures.
