FROM THE VICAR

The Book of Acts starts off with a very subtle yet significant message. See if you can pick it up in the first verse here:

"In the first book, O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach..."

Did you catch it? The Evangelist Luke writes that what happened in his first book (The Gospel of Luke) was just the beginning of what Jesus did and taught. Now if that Gospel records everything from the birth of Jesus all the way through His death, resurrection, and ascension into heaven, how can Luke speak of it as only the beginning?

The story of Acts goes on to answer that question! While Jesus may have ascended into heaven, He is still very much at work through His Church. Throughout Acts, the apostles and disciples continue on with their Lord's work, continuing to proclaim His Gospel, baptizing people as He commanded them, and breaking bread together as He had done with them. Working through the different members of the body of the Church, Jesus adds countless people to His Kingdom, often in the face of great trials or persecution.

Just as Acts begins with a key message, it also ends with one. In the last verse of the book, Paul is "proclaiming the kingdom of God and teaching about the Lord Jesus Christ with all boldness and without hindrance."

There is no wrap up, to climatic conclusion. Instead, there is an open-ended statement that the Gospel is still being proclaimed. Luke is telling us that this chapter in the Church's life still hasn't ended! Still today, the Church proclaims the Gospel of Jesus Christ, of His sacrifice for our sins. Still today, people are joined to the kingdom of God through the waters of Holy Baptism. And still today, we break bread together, our Lord Jesus being both the host and the meal itself.

The deeds and teachings of Jesus still continue through us! Through our one Lord, one Faith, and one Baptism, you – the saints of Hampton, Iowa – are joined to the saints of Corinth, Berea, Antioch, and all the others throughout the world! Take comfort in knowing that just as Jesus was with Peter, Paul, and all the others in the Book of Acts, He is with you as well, today and every day!
